Mr. Cummings Very Ill—William Cummings of Central Point is still taking treatments at the University of California hospital. It was learned here today, and his condition is not at all favorable at present, but hope of his recovery is still maintained at the hospital.

To Grants Pass—W. O. Shambaugh, who has been inspecting machinery belonging to the U. S. forestry service, left this morning for Grants Pass to confer with officials of the Siskiyou national forest. Mr. Shambaugh, whose headquarters are in Portland, spent the week-end in the Lakeview section, returning from there to Medford.

Barneburg Fined—Fred Barneburg was fined \$10 in city court this morning by Judge A. D. Curry on charges of reckless driving. Barneburg, who resides southeast of Medford, was driving the automobile which crashed into the car which B. R. Harwood of 22 Lewis was driving. The collision occurred at 7:15 o'clock last evening at the corner of Sixth and South Central.

Construct Office—Twelve COG men, under the direction of D. R. Dickey, Applegate carpenter foreman, are now working on the new ranger station under construction at Star, on the Applegate. The building includes an office for the ranger, another for his assistant, a lobby and cloak room, with a small porch in front. A wash-house is also under construction there.

Anderson Files Appeal—Notice of appeal from the decision of County Judge Earl B. Day, acting as probate judge, in the suit of Carl Anderson against the Ray H. Toft estate, was filed in circuit court today. Anderson asked \$1,650 for services assertedly rendered for Toft during his lifetime. The court awarded him \$780. Anderson then filed the appeal, and seeks the full amount of his claim against the Toft estate.

Mr. Ziders Here—G. E. Ziders of Portland, who was formerly watchman at the Southern Pacific crossing at Main street, is spending today here attending to business matters, having arrived on the Oregonian this morning. Mr. Ziders is now making his home in the northern city, having been retired on a pension from the Southern Pacific company. He plans to return north tonight.

Takes Prisoners North—Deputy United States Marshal Cal O. Wells returned to Medford this morning from Portland, where he had taken a prison car north from Klamath Falls. Deputy Wells had taken Marvin Duffy Tupper, 20; Carmon Riddle, 17; and Richard Henry, 14, all Indians, indicted by the federal grand jury on charges of robbing a dwelling; Lester Tecumseh, 18; Robert George, 20; and Roland Jackson, 21, indicted for introducing whiskey on the reservation; and Francis Silvers, his wife Healee Moss Silvers, whose bondsmen surrendered them to federal agents last week. The two had been indicted for introducing liquor on the reservation, and their bond had been set at \$2,500. Officer Wells also served four subpoenas at Beatty in the case of Mary Drew Brown Baker, charged with attempted assault with a dangerous weapon.

## DRAWING SETTLES GASOLINE SUPPLY WHEN BIDS ALIKE

In order to comply with the non-competitive clauses of the NRA oil codes, there was no difference in the bids submitted yesterday to the county court for supplying gasoline to Jackson county the coming year. All the bids were identical—21 cents per gallon, from the tank wagon. The names of all the oil companies were placed on strips of paper and placed in a hat, with the agreement between bidders and the county court that the company whose name was drawn from the hat, first would receive the business for the month of February. It happened to be the Standard Oil company. Remainder of the drawings were as follows: Associated Oil for March; Signal Oil Co. for April; General Oil for May; Texas Oil for June; Shell for July; Union for August and Richmond for September.

For the remaining months the county will buy where it pleases. No bids were made on oils, owing to the difference in grades and costs. The county will buy where it can get it the cheapest. The tank wagon price, now 21 cents per gallon, will fluctuate, and the county will pay for a rise or benefit from a drop.

The maximum amount the county asked bids upon is 80,000 gallons, to secure a better price. As the competitive bids were eliminated, there was no maximum set. It will not run more than a quarter of that amount, officials state.

Mr. Nicholson Ill—The ambulance was called to the Jackson County bank building this afternoon for W. E. Nicholson of Ross lane, who became very ill while in the city, and managed to reach a physician's office in that building. Dr. Nicholson's ambulance took the man back to his home, and nothing more had been learned regarding his condition this afternoon.

Letter Carriers' Chieftains Busy—Mr. and Mrs. R. A. Newland, presidents of the Oregon Letter Carriers' association and auxiliary, respectively, have returned to Medford from Klamath Falls, where Monday evening they installed the newly elected officers of the Klamath Falls organization. An invitation was also extended for the Klamath Falls members to attend the state convention to be held in Medford July 14.

Since being elected president of the state association last July, Mr. Newland has traveled over most of the state, visiting many of the local organizations. He stated today that keen interest and growing strength are being noted in the organization and Mr. Newland expects a large attendance at the state meeting. Mr. Newland is also compiling valuable information on these trips, which will be of future benefit to the organization.

DELZELL IN MEDFORD ON OFFICIAL DUTIES—W. A. Delzell, who is slated to become the next postmaster of Salem in all the dope evolving from democratic ranks, was a visitor in Medford this morning, bringing the total of upstate boroughs calling here in the same day to two. His trip was in the interests of the internal revenue department, with which he is now associated.

He stated that he had received no information, to date, confirming his appointment to the Salem postmastership, but those who are "in the know" say he soon will.
