LITRELL RESIGNS AS COUNCILMAN OF SECOND CITY WARD

(Continued from page one) more new face on the council, and Mayor Wilson has already announced that he will not be a candidate for re-election next November.

All councilmen, with the exception of C. C. Darby, attended last night's meeting. City Recorder M. L. Alford, who has been ill since last Friday, was absent and his work was carried on by City Superintendent Fred Scheffel.

A letter from the latter, stating that Medford's sewage plant application was awaiting the distribution of more federal funds, was read. Mr. Parrell made it clear in the letter that Medford's application had met with favorable reports all along the way and that it would probably be approved as soon as funds are available for more public works.

Petitions were presented, providing for the improvement planned on East Main street from Bartlett to Riverside and from Riverside to the bridge, and were referred to the street and roads committee.

A delegation in the interests of this project, headed by Dr. B. R. Elliott, appeared before the council to announce that the signatures had been obtained.

A petition from residents of Court street, asking for paving of that section, was also presented, and a letter from the county court, asking cooperation of the city in completion of this much needed piece of paving, was read.

Attorney N. C. Chaney appeared before the council, representing Harry Furch, who presented a request for removal of his used car business from Sixth and Bartlett to South Riverside.

RABBIT DEMAND SHOWS INCREASE

The demand for rabbit meat is fast increasing, and indications are that the market will continue very good, according to C. C. Althouse, president of the local branch of American Fur Growers Association Incorporated.

The temporary plant for Medford is located at 115 Florence street, and plans are underway to establish a permanent headquarters outside the city limits during the spring.

More than 80 rabbits were prepared for marketing at the local plant in the past three weeks. Maintained for the benefit of breeders of quality meat rabbits within a radius of 100 miles of Medford, plant No. 9 will be devoted to the butchering and marketing of rabbit meat under the nationally advertised DO-RE-ME brand.

The Southern Oregon Mutual Rabbit Breeders association has merged with the American Fur Growers organization and several local officers in addition to Mr. Althouse are P. E. Peck, plant manager, F. E. Finley, vice president, Charles Fischer, secretary, and Mrs. Fischer, treasurer.
