you'd send news to Mobile, 'cause there are some people there that know I'm innocent."

Ernest Waller was the fourth to be put to death. He was convicted of killing "a cheating Negro woman who shone wasn't worth hanging me about."

Solomon Roper, a wandering farm hand, died for killing Page Brazier, his employer, in an argument over \$8. Nine Negroes originally were sentenced to die today. However, one died in prison, the sentences of two others were commuted and the ninth Negro was granted a 30-day reprieve.

Three Negroes died in the electric chair at the state prison in the 36 minutes following midnight today, for Jesse Mott, 250-pounder, who asked the murder of a man and a girl.
