JAPAN PREPARING FOR SIBERIAN WAR

Russian believes Soviet Encircling Frontiers

With Iron and Concrete Is Boast in Report Far East

Soviet Army Commander

MOSCOW, Feb. 13.-[AP]-Japan

is "preparing to leap" to war in Siberia

General Blucher commander of the soviet Far Eastern army

presented to the all-union communist party congress

General Blucher, in revealing Russia's preparations

along the Manchurian border, accused Japan

of making an armed base of Manchukuo

in support of this he charged:

(1) That Japan has sponsored construction

of about 620 miles of railroads in North Manchukuo

in the last two years, 65 per cent of which

regards as economically unnecessary

(2) That about 1367 miles of highways

have been opened in the same region; and

(3) That 50 aviation bases have been concentrated

north of Mukden. He said Japan has 130,000 troops

and 600 airplanes in Manchuria, in addition

to "110,000 to 115,000 soldiers of the Manchukuo army

and 12,000 white guards, capable of bearing arms"

He added: "... I can say our government is able

to concentrate so many airplanes they will outnumber

the Japanese." MOSCOW, Feb. 13.-[AP]-Large

LEVIATHAN ROTS AT DOCK TO SAVE BRITISH SHIPPING

Docking Marks Closing Chapter in Moves by High Finance to Wreck U. S. Merchant Marine Is Claim

NEW YORK, Feb. 13.-[AP]-The New York Evening Post

says in a copyrighted article today that the Leviathan

largest liner in the world, is being allowed to rot

at a Hoboken pier where she was sent in order to remove

"a menace to British shipping." The Post, in a story by

Willis J. Ballinger, says the Leviathan, organized by her

owners, the International Mercantile Marine, to a "feast

of the elements" and that lack of care has already

inflicted a million dollars damage on her. "The docking of the

Leviathan," "marks one of the closing chapters in a chain

of intricate and astounding moves whereby high-powered

finance, the British government and the United States

shipping board have wrecked the American merchant

marine." The Post goes back to 1902, when, it says,

Pierpont Morgan, the elder, organized the International Mercantile Marine, a combination

of seven British lines under an American holding company

The Post calls this "a clever scheme first to pour American

funds into English shipping interests, all the time, actually

to protect British shipping interests from American aggression"
