

BIDS ARE OPENED FOR 19 PROJECTS ON OREGON ROADS

Portland-Oregon City Super Highway Largest Job —Klamath—Weed Work Also Looms as Major Item

PORTLAND, Feb. 16.—(AP)—Bids on 19 Oregon highway projects, amounting to about \$500,000 were opened by the state highway commission at its regular meeting today.

The grading and paving of the north unit of the Portland-Milwaukie section of the Portland-Oregon City super-highway was the largest project considered today, and the Park-Schramm company of Portland was low with a bid of \$162,091.

Another large item was for the bituminous mecadam surfacing of 9.12 miles of the Midland-California line section of the Klamath Falls-Weed highway. Dunn and Baker, Klamath Falls contractors, were low at \$108,540.

Other projects included: Coos County: Paving Coquille section, Oregon Coast highway, R. Stuart & Sons, \$4,361. Paving Marshfield section Oregon Coast highway, United Contracting company, Portland, \$13,824.

Deschutes County: Paving Bend section The Dalles-California and central Oregon highways, Northwest Roads company, Portland, \$34,817.

Hood River County: Bridge over east fork of Hood River, secondary highway near Dee, R. H. Jones, Baker, \$21,851.

Klamath County: Grading 1.8 miles north unit, Midland-California line section Klamath Falls-Weed highway, Dunn and Baker, Klamath Falls, \$21,256.

Lane County: Paving Springfield section McKenzie highway, Cascade Construction company, Portland, \$4,956.

Bridge over Johnson creek at Milwaukie, J. H. Anderson, Portland, \$12,184.

Umatilla County: Bituminous surfacing east Pendleton section of Old Oregon Trail, Northwest Roads company, Portland, \$4,543.

Union County: Bituminous surfacing La Grande section Old Oregon Trail, Northwest Roads company, Portland, \$4,408.

The highway commission issued calls for bids for several rock production projects, after having reached the conclusion that quarries operated by the state are not subject to the sand and gravel code of the NRA, since there is no competition with private industry.

Chairman Leslie M. Scott said that the product taken from such quarries is for the benefit of the public only, and that it is the responsibility of the commission to the motorists who have provided highway revenue, to obtain rock and sand at the lowest cost possible.

In instances where a contractor takes his material from a state quarry, it was the opinion of the commission that such a contractor should be regarded as an employee of the state.

Sand and gravel jobs under consideration have been divided into three classes, the commission announced. These include: Jobs not under the jurisdiction of the sand, gravel and crushed rock code, in which contractors are not required to conform with any code requirement; jobs under the jurisdiction of the code, and concerning which information has been given bidders in specifications, and jobs upon which the commission and code officials have not reached an agreement as to compliance requirements.

For the rock production projects in controversy with the NRA code the projects and low bids follow: Baker County: 3400 cubic yards, Dunn and Baker, Klamath Falls, \$9,990.

Josephine county: 6000 cubic yards A. S. Wallace, \$9,400. Malheur county: 6000 cubic yards, Chester Lackey, Ontario, \$8,700. Morrow County: 3,100 cubic yards, A. A. Hardesty, Portland, \$6,315. Tillamook County: 6,000 cubic yards, A. A. Hardesty, Portland, \$12,895. Umatilla County: 4,500 cu bicyards, A. A. Hardesty, Portland, \$5,250.

Umatilla county: 4200 cubic yards, Jones Scott company, Walla Walla, Wash., \$8,755.

STUNT FLIER TRAPPED IN BURNING AIRPLANE

NEW ORLEANS, Feb. 16.—(AP)—Captain W. Merle Nelson, 36, Los Angeles stunt flier, who a week ago saved Shushan airport officials in the event of a fatal accident to have his body cremated and the ashes strewn over the airfield by fellow aviators, is dead.

Trapped in his plane which crashed and caught fire after failing to become righted from a loop at 600 feet, the flier was burned to death last night. He had been engaged in a "comet display," spectacular flight during which the airport was darkened, only light coming from a giant flare streaking from his plane.

SUSAN B. ANTHONY IS EULOGIZED IN SENATE
