This play will compete with plays presented by Eagle Point and Central Point Granges.

In district number 2, the Jacksonville Grange will also present their play Saturday evening, February 17 at 8:30 p. m. at the high school gymnasium. The play is a one act drama entitled "Ambition," directed by Joe Nee and will be judged by H. P. Jewett, Central Point; Miss Mildred Patterson, Phoenix, and Miss Vera Humphries, of Medford. This play will compete with the Rony Ann Grange play.

In district 3, the Applegate Extension Unit will present the comedy "Kidnaping Betty," Saturday evening, February 17, at 8:30 at the Community hall. Mrs. Dora Krause, director. The judges are H. W.
