(Continued from page one) Johnson was called in for questioning and readily discussed the tragedy with the officers. On examination into his past life indicated that at different times he had been afflicted with lapses of memory and had done unreasonable things.

"He frankly declared," the district attorney stated, "that on the morning Williams disappeared he was engaged in sowing grain in a small plowed field not more than 500 yards from where the Williams body was found the following day. He stated that his mind is extremely hazy regarding the events of the morning, but that he recalls being actually engaged in the sowing of grain, a fact which investigation corroborated, but that his next conscious act was that of walking towards his field across the pasture lot which lay between the wooded area in which Williams' body was found and the grain field."

Gone Long Time "Johnson, according to his statement," the district attorney said, "left his home about 8 a. m. and did not return until about 10:30 a. m.

Further examinations are to be made. He will probably be sent later to the state asylum to be kept under observation for a period of from 30 to 60 days before any further action is taken with regard to filing of a murder charge.
