

# RURAL THESPIANS VIE SATURDAY FOR COUNTY LAURELS

### Three One-Act Plays to Be Presented at Junior High by Bellview, Eagle Point and Jacksonville Casts

Everything is in readiness for the public presentation of the rural dramatics contest plays at the Junior high school auditorium, Medford, Saturday evening, February 24. There will be three one-act plays given by the Bellview, Eagle Point and Jacksonville Granges. Each of these plays won first place in their respective districts in the county-wide dramatics preliminaries. The plays will be judged Saturday evening by Dr. Arthur Taylor of the Southern Oregon Normal school, Rev. Wm. J. Howell of Medford, and Miss Louise Howard of Grants Pass. An Annual Affair.

The contest is held annually under the supervision of Mabel C. Mack, home demonstration agent, as a part of the extension project in recreation and dramatics. The purpose of the contest is to encourage more recreation and dramatics work among adult groups, and to aid in better play selection and better production.

A dramatics training school for play directors was given in January through the extension services with Jack Stuart Knapp of the National Recreation Association as instructor. An approved list of plays to be used in the contest was prepared by the home economics extension department of Oregon State college, thus eliminating the necessity of scoring plays on selection. Plays will be judged on direction and acting only. Interest in Finals.

The plays this year have been exceptionally fine and much interest is being shown in the final contest. The dramatics committee, composed of Claire Hanley, Jacksonville; Victor Bursell, Central Point; Mrs. Elsie Hoover, Rocky Ann, is in charge of arrangements for the final showing. Mrs. Eldora Bohmert is music chairman; Harry Ward is ticket chairman, and Mrs. O. C. Maust, publicity chairman.

The program is as follows: Piano solo by Cyril Sanders; Collection of Scotch Airs, Joe Nee, Jacksonville; "Miss Maria," presented by Eagle Point Grange, directed by Mrs. Madeline Barrett. This is a charming play with an 1860 setting, and is taken from Tales of Old Chester. The cast is as follows: Miss Maria, Welwood, Yeta Olson; Miss Rose, Mary Weidman; Mr. Charles Welwood, William Miller; Mrs. Maria, Barbara, Jesse Mittelstaedt; Mr. Ezra Berkley, Clarence Davies.
