

# INVITE ROOSEVELT TO BE VISITOR AT DIAMOND JUBILEE

An invitation has been extended to President Franklin D. Roosevelt to attend Oregon's Diamond Jubilee celebration by Governor Julius L. Meier, as announced by Chamber of Commerce officials this morning.

The governor's letter follows:

**The President,**  
White House  
Washington, D. C.  
**Mr. President:**

"This year marks the 75th anniversary of Oregon's admission to the union.

"Our State Legislative Assembly has officially designated the city of Medford and Jackson county, Oregon, as hosts for Oregon's Diamond Jubilee celebration, which will be held from June 8 till June 9.

"Press reports indicate that you have been giving thought to the possibility of making a trip during the summer months which may bring you to the Pacific coast.

"On behalf of the people of Oregon, may I extend to you and Mrs. Roosevelt a most cordial invitation to visit our state and to participate in our Diamond Jubilee celebration. Needless to say, it would give us the greatest pleasure to have the privilege of entertaining as our guests the nation's chief executive and his party. The entire state would unite in doing everything possible to make your visit a happy and interesting one.

"I fully realize the many demands placed upon you and the impossibility of acceding to the multitude of requests you receive. However, if plans for your western trip materialize, I earnestly and respectfully urge you to give careful thought to the possibility of including on your itinerary a visit to Oregon's Diamond Jubilee celebration.

Governor Meier has also asked Secretary of Agriculture Henry A. Wallace to attend the celebration on Orange day.

While, of course, it cannot be determined whether the president or secretary Wallace will accept the invitation, their replies will be eagerly awaited by the Jubilee celebration officials.

**Sliced Ham Savory**  
Round slice ham.  
2 tablespoons flour.  
1 teaspoon mustard.  
1 tablespoon chopped onions.  
2 tablespoons chopped green peppers.  
1/4 teaspoon salt.  
1-3 cup vinegar.  
2-3 cup water.  
1/2 cup brown sugar.  
Have ham cut two-thirds inch thick. Place in shallow pan. Spread with dry ingredients, add vinegar and water, cover and bake one hour in moderate oven.

**Turn ham several times to allow even baking.**

**Escalloped Potatoes**  
3 cups potatoes.  
3 tablespoons flour.  
2-3 teaspoon salt.  
1-3 teaspoon paprika.  
2 cups milk.  
2 tablespoons butter.

**Blend potatoes, flour and seasonings. Add remaining ingredients. Bake one hour in moderate oven. Serve in dish in which baked.**

**Vegetable Salad**  
2-3 cup green beans.  
1/2 cup lima beans.  
1/2 cup diced celery.  
2 tablespoons chopped onions.  
1 tablespoon chopped pimientos.  
1/4 teaspoon salt.  
Mix and chill ingredients. Serve on lettuce with French dressing.

**Apples and potatoes require less baking time if they are boiled for 10 minutes and then put into the oven.**

# SEA SERPENT ARMY SIGHTED BY THREE 'TRUTHFUL' GENTS

**NANAIMO, B. C., Feb. 23.—(P)—**On George Washington's birthday, three Canadians swore they saw Amy Hinchukoluck, the sea-serpent of British Columbia, and she "hisses like a steam engine."

"This isn't all, said Jerry Hynek, F. F. Smith and Jim Yards, who today claimed they would not tell a lie, for the great 80-foot serpent sped through the water "at the rate of 10 nautical knots per hour."

The serpent, first reported off Pointedboro, B. C., and then reported at various points up and down the Pacific coast by more than 100 reputable citizens, has a head like a horse, a neck 20 inches thick, and the faculty of swimming under water and producing terrific hissing when exhaling air after coming up to breathe.

The three said they saw "Amy" off Gabriola island, "speeding along like an express train," about six feet of her body being visible.

"We ran along the beach," said Smith, explaining that "Amy" dove under water after they first saw her. "The serpent, or whatever it was, broke again into sight after traveling 150 feet under water. It came up again with a hissing noise, and water foamed from its neck as it sped along faster than we could run."

The monster finally disappeared into deep water in the Gulf of Georgia, they said.

# SPANISH FAMILY SEES HOME HIT BY METEOR FOLLOWING HASTY EXIT

**SEVILLE, Spain, Feb. 23.—(AP)—**Francisco Megia told today his own story of the destruction of his home by what he and all his neighbors at the village of Rinconada believe to have been a meteor's fall.

Senor Megia and his family sat down in their home for lunch between noon and 1 p. m., February 18. Suddenly there was the noise as of an airplane flying low over the cottage.

Jose Megia, 13 years old, rushed to the door. He saw a dense column of smoke dropping from the sky toward the roof.

Panic stricken, he shouted his alarm.

Senor Megia tried to run to the house for more belongings, they were stopped by a short, deafening noise and their cottage was immediately enveloped in flames.

Farmers in the neighborhood heard the noise and hastened to the aid of the family.

**ELLENSBURG, Wash., Feb. 23.—**(AP)—Joe Stoddard, editor of the Ellensburg Weekly Capital and veteran state newspaper man, is dead today and two others are in the hospital here badly injured following an accident on the Snoqualmie Pass highway late last night.

Their car crashed head-on into a parked truck, killing Stoddard instantly and injuring Kenneth Reynolds and William Webster, Ellensburg business men.

## CUTTER RACES TO AID CREW ABOARD TANKER

**SAN FRANCISCO, Cal., Feb. 23.—**(AP)—Ground on reefs of Cerros island off the desolate coast of Lower California, the 5000-ton steam tanker Swift Eagle, with 40 men aboard, was battered by heavy seas today as coast guard cutters raced to the rescue.

Wireless messages indicated the tanker, one of the largest in inter-coastal service, was badly damaged.
