General Johnson, fiery as always, dared its critics to "cut loose with anything they had to say about the organization's errors, mistakes and blunders," and then turned in and roundly denounced "dishonest criticisms."

WHAT is the dishonest criticism of NRA? Well, this writer would say it is criticism by one who professes to fear that NRA won't work, but who really fears it WILL.

DOONALD RICHBERG, NRA counsel, emphasized its program as one of economic revolution but not political revolt.

"Some people," he said, "may prefer marching blackshirts, brownshirts or redshirts, but we in NRA believe in marching toward the old goal of the greatest happiness for the greatest number of people."
