

JURY SELECTION IN DAMAGE SUIT GETS UNDER WAY

Selection of a jury in the damage suit of Delbert Tingleaf of Eagle Point, against the C. E. Gates Auto company of this city was underway in circuit court this morning. Tingleaf is a minor, and the suit is filed by his mother as guardian. Tingleaf is represented by Attorneys T. J. Enright and H. Von Schmals of Burns. The auto company is represented by Attorney George M. Roberts of this city and C. E. Gates of Portland.

The damage suit is based upon an auto accident on the Butte Falls road, nearly two years ago, and involves Tingleaf and two other Eagle Point district youths—Ralph Dinsmore and Jesse Walton. Walton sustained injuries and Tingleaf sustained two broken legs, it was claimed. Dinsmore is alleged to have driven the auto at an excessive rate of speed it overturned at a curve.

The plaintiff contends that a salesman for the auto concern granted Dinsmore permission to drive the car, when the salesman called upon the father to demonstrate the auto. The defense contends that Dinsmore took the auto without permission, and that Walton and Tingleaf accepted his invitation to ride.

Tingleaf seeks \$25,000 general damages; \$10,000 for "pain and suffering," and \$1500.75 as special damages.

TAX PAYMENTS IN GREATER VOLUME

Tax payments in Jackson county the past two days have exceeded the 200 mark, according to the tax collection department of the sheriff's office. This is nearly double the number for the same period last year. The payments are for years from 1927 to 1933.

March 15 is the final date for payment of taxes under new tax laws passed by the last session of the law a taxpayer may pay all his taxes by that date and receive a 3 per cent rebate on the total amount.

Many are taking advantage of this rebate. A more optimistic spirit of the people and more money in circulation has also speeded payments.

On quarterly tax payments, which a taxpayer may make if he desires, a 2 per cent rebate is allowed if he pays three-fourths of his taxes by March 15. A 1 per cent rebate is allowed if he pays half his taxes. If no payments are made interest at the rate of two-thirds of 1 per cent interest is assessed monthly.
