

BENEFITS TO CITY UNDER CWA LISTED BY SUPT. SCHEFFEL

Bear Creek Improvement, Airport Project, Road and Street Work Make Imposing Total — Finish Near

A tremendous amount of work for times when economy is foremost in the minds of governing bodies, was accomplished last month through the city superintendent's office, according to the report submitted to the street and roads committee and the city council Tuesday night by Fred Scheffel.

Through the CWA projects, much of the work was accomplished. The airport work, the report showed, is 90 per cent complete. The report pending under this application consists of placing 2000 cubic yards of crushed rock and granite on the cross runway. The amended application approved, provides for an additional \$8000 to be spent on the airport here, bringing the total to \$24,800.

Bear Creek Wall Planned.
The Bear creek improvement is now 85 per cent complete and the city is now planning to build a rock wall north of the Bear creek bridge.

Under street improvements, made possible by the CWA, the city is proceeding with the elimination of the East Main street curve and excavation of North Court street. This work is also 88 per cent complete.

The road to the Prescott Memorial park is 69 per cent complete, extending to station 208.

During the month of February, exclusive of CWA work, the alleys in the business section were swept once each week and 32 loads of buckshot were hauled for surfacing alleys.

Airport Improved.
The floor in the waiting room at the airport was re-painted and eight new signs, directing traffic, were painted. All flood lights in front of the hangar building were painted.

The walls of the city hall were kalsomined and the woodwork painted.

The street sweeper traveled 180 miles during the month and picked up 32 loads of sweepings. Two hundred and nineteen loads of buckshot were hauled on the various streets and 20 cubic yards of black top placed in bad chuck holes of the streets.

CENTRAL POINT GRANGE BACKS GEHLAR STAND ON BUTTER MARKETING
