Tye's lineup included Grenier, Putman, Roberts, Cain, Austin and Thrasher. Thrasher was high point man for his team with 14 points. Marugg of Applegate was high point man of the game with 15. Tungate, Bandell, Morningstar, Rodgers and Burnett concluded the Applegate lineup.

snowed Dallas under a 47-to-20 avalanche, while Jefferson high of Portland, appearing over trained, succumbed to the fast quintet from The Dalles, 35 to 22. Coquille and Ashland vanquished Mitchell and Columbia earlier in the day.

The mortality of favorites in the first round of games was heavy but, as far as dope upsets, there was but one—Ashland's victory over the strong Columbia prep aggregation. Of the three Portland teams only one, Franklin, survived the day as far as the championship fight was concerned.

And in that contest, Franklin had difficulty holding its slight lead throughout the entire second half. Both Portland high school teams appeared tired as the result of their inter-city schedule, and neither one appeared to click and no promises were seen they would enter the finals, either in the championship or the consolation.

Pendleton high started out fast against Salem, then dropped back after the first few minutes, but held the lead at half time to 13 to 10. Under the leadership of little Dean Galloway, fast breaking forward, the Eastern Oregon delegation was always a threat until the final moments, when Salem finally succeeded in finding the basket. The host team had plenty of shots, but could not connect until late in the game.

Klamath Falls earned the title of "iron men" in the first round, the only team which did not run in any substitutions during the entire contest, in which they had a battle to defeat Silverton. Scott, forward for Silverton, led his quintet in a fast game. He is the only member of the all-state team of last year back in the tournament this season.

Klamath Pelicans led at the quarter, but dropped behind Silverton, 17 to 13, at half time. A tie of 22-22 ended the third period, while in the final eight minutes the southerners forged ahead to win, 31 to 28. Miller, Klamath center, was high scorer for the game with eight field goals.
