

### COLLEGE STUDENT FEE OPTION PLAN MAY CUT ACTIVITY

### O. S. C. Campus Heads Fear Reduced Support for Forensics, Band, Glee Clubs and Spring Athletics

CORVALLIS, March 29.—(AP)—The Daily Barometer, student newspaper at Oregon State College, today issued a special edition devoted to an appeal to students of the college to rescue student self-government from threatened collapse because of the recently ordered "optional fee plan" which leaves the associated students only 28 per cent of their expected income.

The attorney general has ruled that the associated students may not impose fees on students at the institutions of higher learning.

Warren Reid, editor of the Barometer, declared in a front page editorial that no agitation for optional fees had occurred at Oregon State and that normal payment of the fees probably would have taken place had not orders been received from the board of higher education Saturday night requiring the posting of optional notices and making other changes in the plan after it was too late for campus leaders to meet the situation.

Unless the condition changes this week, either by voluntary payment or by some action of the board, the college will be obliged to put the Daily Barometer on a twice-a-week basis, to reduce by one-half support of forensics, band, glee clubs, orchestra and lyceum activities, and to curtail the spring athletic program by eliminating either baseball and track entirely, or by reducing both to a "back-yard" basis. EUENE, March 29.—(AP)—Approximately half of the students registering at the University of Oregon voluntarily paid the \$5 fee for membership in the Associated Students, it was announced yesterday by university officials. Payment of the fee is now optional due to a recent ruling of the attorney general that the institution could not collect it unless volunteered by the student.

A total of 1890 students had completed registration last night and 1890 had taken out registration material. Last year at this time a total of 1883 had taken out material. At the close of registration last night 47.1 per cent of those completing registration had elected to pay the \$5 fee and \$2.9 had stated they did not wish to pay it. A few students from this latter group came in today and paid the additional fee, however, stating that when they realized the number of activities they would miss they preferred to pay the five dollars.

SALEM, Ore.—(UP)—Milk is one of the most wholesome and economical foods and contains vitamins A, B and D, tests taken by the state agricultural department show.

A gallon of whole milk contains the following ingredients: Milk sugar, 6 8-10 ounces; casein, 4.9210 ounces; lime, necessary for strong teeth and bones, 70 grains; potash, 75 grains; phosphorus, 36 grains; chloride, 56 grains; magnesium, 7 grains; soda, 29 grains; sulphur, 2 grains, and iron, 1/2 grain.

### BAVARIAN JEWS DIE IN DEMONSTRATION

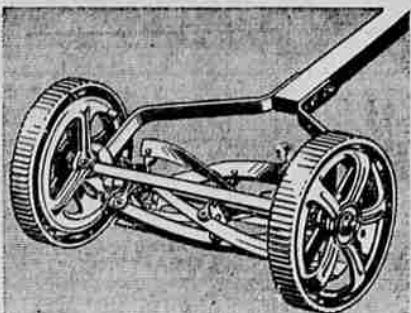
