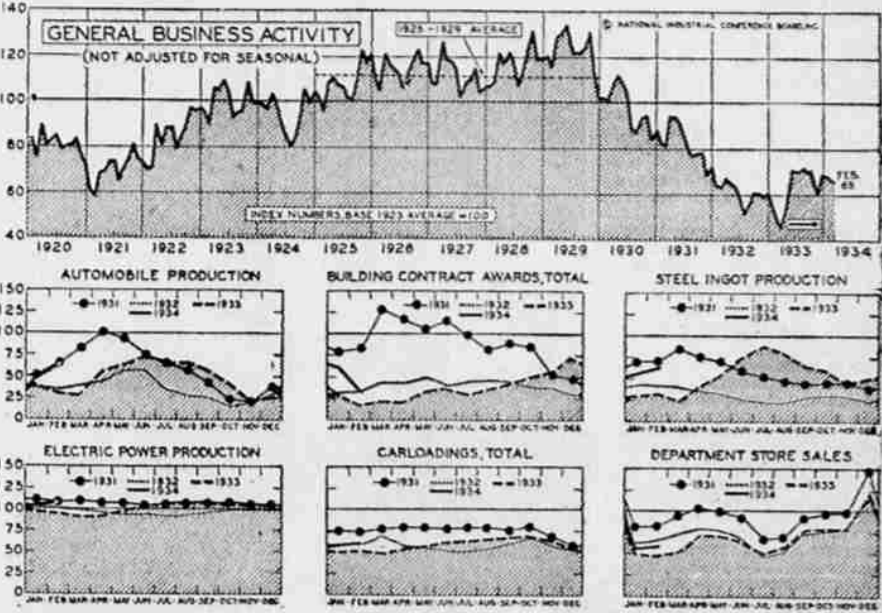

Business Activity :: February Shows Gains Except in Construction



General business activity showed gains of more than seasonal proportions for February and the first part of March with one exception, it was reported by the conference of statisticians in industry of the National Industrial Conference Board. Building and engineering construction, alone of the basic industries, declined, the board reported. This sharp drop pulled the charted line of activity downward for the month. More Passenger Cars, Trucks Produced. Production of passenger cars and trucks in February for the United States and Canada was 42 per cent larger than in January and 118 per cent over a year ago. Production in the first part of March showed an extension of the previous month's gains. Total of building contracts and awards fell sharply in February to a point 33 per cent under the December 1933 peak. Curtailment of operations was centered largely in public construction and non-residential building. Steel production expanded rapidly in February, and output continued to increase the first part of March. Steel operations last month were at 42.8 per cent of capacity against 34.1 per cent in January. Electric power production in February rose 2.1 per cent over January and 14 per cent over a year ago. Cold weather, which curtailed building operations, fostered the power increase. Rail shipments of all classes of commodities in February increased 8.5 per cent over January and 19 per cent over a year ago. Recent seasonal advances average 1.8 per cent. Department store sales advanced in dollar value of turnover by 1.8 per cent from January to February to a level 16 per cent over a year ago, a movement contrary to seasonal expectations. Unit volume of turnover advanced 1.5 per cent. Compared with a year ago it was 5 per cent under, because the price level had advanced proportionately more than the dollar value of sales.
