PORTLAND, Ore., April 5.—(AP)—Ted Cox, 220, Lead, Calif., lost on a foul in the third fall of a feature wrestling match with Jack Forsgren, Vancouver, B. C., here last night. Referee Verne Harrington awarded the match to Forsgren on the basis of two low blows.

Cox took the first fall with a body press, after flooring Forsgren repeatedly with elbowed lefts and rights to the head and body. Forsgren took the second with a Boston crab.

In the third encounter, Cox began to work on the Canadian's midriff. Two low blows cost him the match. Cox was escorted from the ring by a police body guard, while Forsgren was carried out by his handlers.
