Mrs. Sara Watt Prentiss, professor of parent education at Oregon State college, will conduct the session until noon, having as her topic "The Social Development of the Children." A covered dish luncheon will be held at noon.

Mrs. Bertha Young is scheduled to preside over the afternoon session which opens at 1:30 o'clock, with Mrs. Mack speaking on Jackson county radio clubs. Mrs. William Kietzer, state president of the P.-T. A., will speak on how the state safeguards our children.

"The Importance of Emotional Maturity" is the subject of Miss Claribel Nye's address. Miss Nye is state leader of home economics extension work. Mrs. Prentiss will again talk at the afternoon gathering on "Understanding the Adolescent."

At 4 o'clock tea will be served by the county extension committee. The day's program marks the completion of the child development study club work, which has been carried on by local leadership in 14 groups throughout Jackson county during the past eight months.

SANTA CLARA FARM COMMUNITY PLANNED

SAN JOSE, Cal., April 6.—(UP)—A plan to establish a new agricultural community of 10,000 persons in the Santa Clara valley under federal sponsorship was revealed here last night by Jack Silby, manager of the San Jose chamber of commerce.

The self-supporting colony is planned under President Roosevelt's subsistence colony program, Silby said. The plan calls for the government to obtain some 40,000 acres of land, preferably in one tract, and to assist settlers financially until the community becomes wholly self-supporting.

terior and the agriculture departments for the forestry service still is a classic, and it is known that the interior department would not oppose receiving it at the present time.

The public domain bill, written by Representative Taylor (D., Colo.) would vest control of the 173,000,000 acres of public domain in the interior department. Over-grazing, Secretary Ickes has said, is reducing the public domain to waste land.

Conservation Needed. De Rouen said for ten years everyone had been agreed on the principle that grazing of public lands, most of which are in 11 western states, should be supervised by the government as a conservation measure. The disagreement has been on how control should be established and who should have jurisdiction.

Unity of control, he said, was to be desired, but his committee felt that, since 75 per cent of public lands functions already were under the direction of the interior department, this one should go there.

It was indicated sponsors of the bill in the house would not oppose the transfer of the forestry service should the initiative be taken in the senate.
