

ANGELS INCREASE LEAGUE LEAD BY TWO FULL GAMES

Portland Loses, 10 to 0, When Salso, Solon Hurler, Allows But Three Bingles — Reds Trim Seals, 10-0

(By the Associated Press.)
The hard-hitting Los Angeles Angels found themselves in front of the field by two full games in the Pacific Coast league today, after the first night game in the league this season had brought the San Francisco Seals their second straight setback.

The Angels took their second straight game from the Hollywood Stars, 11 to 7, in a free hitting affair yesterday. Frank Demaree, Angel outfielder, hit a home-run to increase his season's total to five.

A crowd officially estimated at 5,000 saw the San Francisco Missions go on a scoring spree to defeat the Seals, 10 to 5, in the first night contest. Both starting pitchers, James Zinn of the Seals and Clarence Mitchell of the Missions, were driven from the mound.

Holding the Portland Beavers to three bingles, Manuel Salvo hurled the Sacramento Senators to a 10 to 0 victory. The game was on fairly even terms until the eighth inning when the Senators pounded one nine hits the score 8 to 0. Second baseman Alex Kampouris hit a homer and a single in the same inning to bring in four runs. Portland used three pitchers.

A ninth inning home-run by Leroy Anton, first baseman, brought Oakland a 6 to 5 win over the Seattle Indians.
