## SCISSORS STAR TO MATCH GRIP WITH HEADLOCK

Billy Edwards, Kansas City butcher-boy, an old-time favorite of southern Oregon wrestling fans, returns to Medford tonight to tackle Les Wolfe, popular Texan, who has been making Medford his headquarters for some time. Edwards will pit his famous chiropractic headlock against the devastating rolling scissors of the Texan and the result should be a thriller for the cash customers. Wolfe is scheduled to leave soon on a tour of California and the southwest.

Something new in the grunt and grimace game will be offered on the armory mat card tonight by Promoter Mack Lillard, who has signed a pair of husky college athletic stars to fill out the other half of the double-main event bill. Marvin Westenberg, handsome University of Puget Sound grid performer, will meet Robert Evans, Harvard student, who has turned to the bone crushing racket to replenish his educational fund. Both Westenberg and Evans are far from novices in the ungentle art and each has a number of victories to his credit against men of much greater experience.

Both matches are scheduled to go one hour or best two out of three falls.

Tickets for all seats will be at a uniform price and two sections have been reserved by the promoter for those who wish to purchase tickets in advance so that they may arrive at the last minute with assurance of securing a good seat. The show opens at 8:30.

Edwards, 200, took the first fall with his famous chiropractic headlock, and the final fall with a body press. Helwig, 201, won the second fall with a flying head scissor.

Charlie Hansen, 210, Seattle, and Jack League, 215, San Antonio, Tex., went to a draw in the semi-final.

Chief Little Wolf, 300, Trinidad, Colo., took one fall from Walter Siroala, 192, New Westminster, B. C.

At the conclusion of his bout with Edwards, Helwig was arrested on a charge of disorderly conduct for his actions in last week's wrestling match when he was alleged to have reached through the ropes and grabbed referee Verne Harrington. The serving of the warrant, the police announced, was part of a campaign to preclude disorders at wrestling bouts.

Picking up where she left off with her dazzling campaign of a year ago, the 15-year-old Miami Beach, Fla., high school girl made her first start in championship competition for 1934 last night and came up with a title and a new world's mark in the 300-yard individual medley, an event that demands speed, endurance and versatility. Making a show of her field of older and stronger rivals, "Katie" swam the distance in 4 minutes 12.2 seconds, bettering her old mark of 4:14.8 by 2.6 seconds.
