

GLEEMEN'S SPRING CONCERT SET FOR MONDAY, MAY 14

Monday, May 14, has been chosen as the date of the spring concert of the Medford Gleemen. It was announced today by James Stevens, director, and two guest artists will be featured. Mr. Stevens also revealed they are: Frances Mullen, pianist, and Dorothy Wagner, dancer, who will arrive here on tour from Canada.

Miss Mullen, described in press dispatches as a "brilliant California pianist," has won high favor with the musical public by her numerous appearances with prominent clubs, colleges and other organizations. She has been a pupil of the finest teachers in America and spent several years studying in Europe.

The opportunity to see a professional dancer is one expected to please hosts of southern Oregonians and Miss Wagner promises to satisfy their long desire for such entertainment. She spent three years with the Metropolitan Opera ballet, followed by three years in musical comedy. A tour of Spain and Portugal, which followed later, preceded her return to New York, where she became a member of the Michlo Ito company for a coast-to-coast tour. Prior to returning to New York in 1932 as a solo dancer, Miss Wagner had the distinction of being the first dancer engaged by the Hollywood Bowl in an exclusively solo capacity.

The associate membership tickets sold for Gleemen concerts this season will be accepted at the May 14 program.
