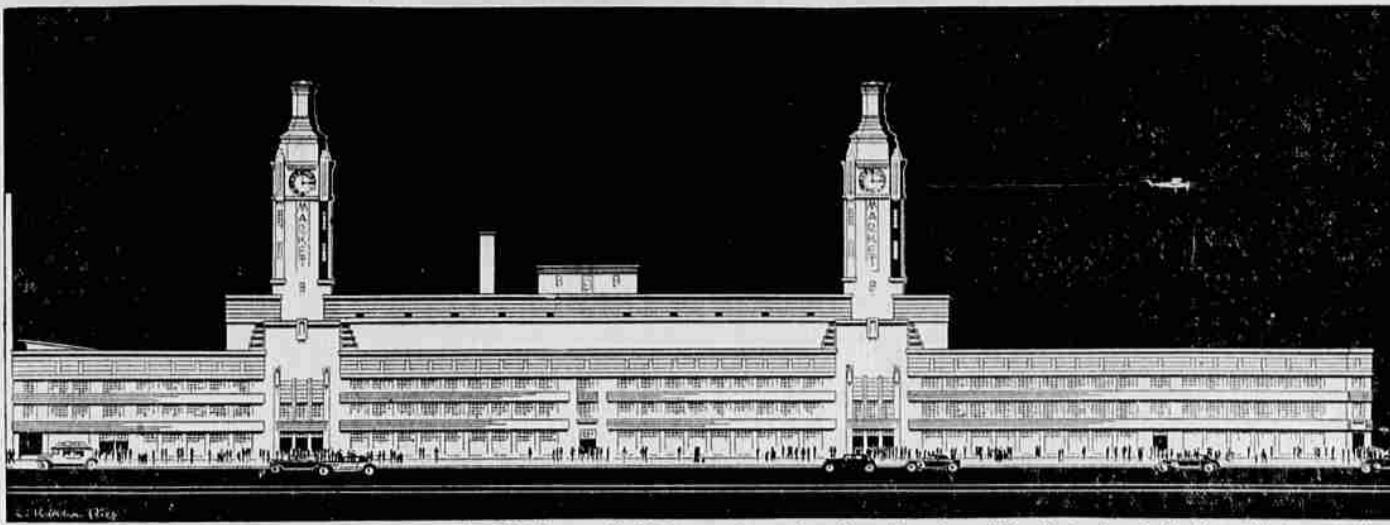


Jackson County Products Will Be Featured Oct. 3-6



Jackson county products will be featured in exhibits and on sale at the fine new Portland Public Market October 3, 4, 5 and 6, through a plan presented to the Medford Chamber of Commerce by officials of the market. The plan, expected to attract all agriculturists of the Rogue River valley, sets aside the dates mentioned as Jackson County days at the market

when produce from this region will be displayed and sold, the profits to go to the farmers, who supply the produce. The Portland public market opened last December 15 and occupies the \$1,000,000 building shown above. It is conceded to be the largest and most modern in the world. A special committee will be named soon by the Medford Chamber of Commerce to secure the co-operation of farmers in the display and sale.

WAR ON ILLEGAL LIQUOR MAKERS TREASURY PLAN

Agents Seize 73 Stills, 84,000 Gallons of Spirits in Week—Industry Bad As Ever Is Declaration

WASHINGTON, April 20.—(AP)—Secretary Morgenthau told reporters today that the manufacture of illicit liquors is still "a very husky industry." He said he planned to "hit and hit it hard."

The treasury head explained the department was "beginning to get interested in the illicit manufacture" of intoxicants because on May 10 the old prohibition unit will be transferred from the justice department to the bureau of industrial alcohol. That is under the treasury.

Morgenthau disclosed revenue agents already had started seizing stills and illegal spirits.

He said 73 stills were taken last week throughout the country, along with 84,000 gallons of spirits and 173,000 gallons of mash valued at \$17,000.

This illegal business, he said, appears to be "as bad as it ever was." On May 10, the force available to stamp out the illegal liquor trade will total about 1,500, of whom perhaps 750 will have been taken from the justice department.

The secretary said rum running from the high seas was considerably less than during the prohibition era. He explained the number of vessels sending liquor into the country from both the Pacific and Atlantic is far less.

GOVERNOR CALLS ON CITIZENS TO BUY STATE GOODS

In sponsorship of the "Oregon Products" days, an educational drive to promote home buying of home products of Oregon, Governor Julius L. Meier has issued a statement to the people of Oregon. This statement follows:

"I commend to the attention of the citizens of Oregon, 'All Oregon Products Days' from April 30 to April 28, inclusive. We have all heard many times the message that by supporting the products of Oregon farms, forests and factories, we can do much to promote the progress and prosperity of our state.

"Increase in the use and distribution of Oregon products means the stimulation of industry and the expansion of payrolls. Expanding the payrolls means better home markets for our surplus products, and these, too, mean increased prosperity for our state and increased well-being for our people.

"All Oregon Products Days' will give merchants a chance to acquaint the public with the high quality and favorable price of Oregon-made and Oregon-grown merchandise. The public, in turn, will learn of the products that keep our manufacturing plants in operation and maintain our lumber, agricultural, fishing, and other industries.

"State-wide pride in Oregon products and a state-wide determination that price and quality being equal, we will use the output of our own industries will do much to speed the return to normal prosperity.

"I earnestly urge that buyers and sellers alike will enter into a whole-hearted observance of 'All Oregon Products Days' and that the beneficial effects of this observance will make themselves felt throughout the year in better business for Oregon and more work for Oregonians.

SECOND COVER SPRAY FOR CODLING CONTROL NEEDED SOON IS WORD

The second cover spray for the control of codling moth worms should be completed on all varieties of pear and apples by April 28. Such is the advice of L. G. Gentner, entomologist of the Southern Oregon Experiment station, and L. F. Wilcox, county agent.

On apples the combination oil emulsion arsenate of lead spray is recommended at this time. The solution to be made up as follows: One gallon light type summer oil emulsion, plus one-half pound spreader, plus two pounds arsenate of lead to the hundred gallons of water.

On pears, use powdered arsenate

of lead, three pounds to the 100 gallons of water.

Heavy flights of codling moths occurred during the past few evenings, indicating that the peak of the first brood has arrived. This means that a large number of young worms will be hatching at the time specified above, therefore, this application as called for is of extreme importance if clean fruit is to be grown. Make it a point to spray thoroughly, drenching all leaves and fruits.

Chicken Reception Salad

2 cups diced chicken
1 cup halved and seeded Malag grapes
1/2 cup diced celery
1/2 cup shredded toasted almonds
Whipped cream

1 pimiento, chopped
