ANSWER OF SHERIFF'S NOT DEFINITE CLAIMS; MAN ASKING DAMAGE

James T. Kinkade of Phoenix, who sued the sheriffs of Jackson and Klamath counties for damages for alleged false imprisonment, has filed a motion in circuit court, asking the answer of the defendants be made "more definite and certain" through his counsel, Attorney M. O. Wilkins. The motion applies to Deputies Dale Mattoon of Klamath county and Deputy Phil Stansbury of this county. The Jackson county defendants in their answer set forth that they made the arrest upon information furnished by the Klamath county officials, that Kinkade was sought on a warrant alleging non-support. He was held in the Jackson county jail and then transferred to the Klamath county jail. Kinkade also alleges that he was subject to trial before the " kangaroo courts" in the two prisons and his money taken for fines. He avers that when released from the
