

DOLLFUSS DODGES DYNAMITE DEATH

SALEZBURG, Austria, May 10.—(AP)—Chancellor Engelbert Dollfuss again narrowly escaped death today when authorities found a high explosive bomb at the airport station here shortly before he arrived from Vienna for a patriotic front meeting.

The infernal machine contained 11 pounds of kraaitite and was equipped with clockwork. However, the little chancellor appeared unperturbed by the discovery. He and Prince Ernst Von Starhemberg, the handsome vice chancellor and head of the Fascist Heimwehr, were showered with flowers.

WAR IS OPENED ON BOOTLEGGERS

WASHINGTON, May 10.—(AP)—A new blow was aimed at bootleggers today by the government and Secretary Morgenthau asserted that "we mean business."

The treasury's new alcohol tax unit went into action under Arthur J. Mellett, 45-year old Kansas City attorney, in an effort to drive out the illicit liquor trade.

"We find the public very sympathetic to the drive to stop the bootleg trade and believe with the successful cooperation we should be successful," Morgenthau said at his press conference.
