

LOWER ROGUE TO BE DREDGED FOR PRECIOUS METAL

GOLD BEACH, Ore., May 11.—(Sp.) The Consolidated Mining corporation has begun the construction of what may develop into the first unit of an enormous gold dredging operation on the lower Rogue. Having leased from the MacLeay Estate company, on a royalty basis, such of its holdings as are on tidewater, the Consolidated people have under construction a barge on which will be mounted a pump having a capacity of about 1400 cubic yards of sand per day. This sand will be processed for the recovery of gold and, if it shows a reasonable amount of color, the company proposes to add five or six more dredges having a capacity of about three times the one now being built. This first unit will be operating within five or six weeks, according to the officials.

J. S. Waybright, mining engineer, and James R. Sellers, engineer, both of Los Angeles, are here supervising the initial work. It is proposed to use this smaller outfit to assay the holdings.

The land leased from MacLeay extends from near the hole at the lower end of what is known as Canfield riffle to the sea front and includes thousands of acres of ground and two large islands. One somewhat smaller outfit is already working on a small part of the site.
