Two Withdraw. Although the ballot will carry the names of seven candidates for the Republican nomination as governor, only five remained actively in the race today.

Many of those claiming political precedence concluded that the Republican race for the governorship was a neck-and-neck race between Joe E. Dunne, state senator from Portland, and Rufus C. Holman, state treasurer.

Mort Mott Opposition. James W. Mott, Republican incumbent, was opposed for re-nomination as congressman from the first district (western Oregon) by J. M. Devers, highway commission attorney.

Walter M. Pierce of LaGrande, congressman from the second (eastern Oregon) district, was unopposed for re-nomination by either David F. Graham of Vale or State Senator Jay H. Upton of Bend who oppose him in the general election in November.

In the third (Portland) district, the five Republicans seeking the congressional nomination were J. E. Bennett, city commissioner; Robert M. Stanfield, who in 1918 was United States senator from Oregon; W. A. Ekwall, circuit judge; Harry M. Kenin and W. Shugrue. In the Democratic field was Walter B. Gleason, Democratic nominee for United States senator in the last general election; John J. Beckman, state representative; Ralph M. Erwin and G. C. Fretwell.
