

REV. LA ROSE TO BECOME PASTOR OF CITY CHURCH

Reverend John T. LaRose, pastor of the Nazarene church here, announced today that he is resigning his pastorate at the local church and will go to the Calvary church in Portland. He will deliver his fare-

Reverend F. M. Weatherford of Santa Rosa, Calif., will come to Medford to become pastor of the church here.

Reverend LaRose will leave Monday to spend a week in Seattle at the church assembly, then return to Medford for about a week.

He has served as pastor at the local church for the past four years, coming here from Eureka, Calif. Reverend LaRose also served as dean of the Northwestern Nazarene college at Rampa, Ida., for three years.

Reverend LaRose has served as president of the local ministerial association, for the past two years, and has taken a prominent part in civic as well as church affairs.

OPENING OF CHATEAU BRINGS REALIZATION CATHELINEAUS DREAM

A realization of dreams come true, the Chateau du Comte, near the Jackson Hot Springs south of Medford, was opened this week amidst an atmosphere of Old France, offering southern Oregon residents a unique establishment. Months ago a dream was born in the mind of Count B. de Cathelineau and for weeks construction has been underway reaching completion this week and bringing definite form to the vision.

Count de Cathelineau, whose royal coat of arms remains with the family, traveled the entire length of the Pacific coast searching for a location for the chateau. None so took his fancy as southern Oregon.

With funds which came direct from France, he built the chateau around trees which pierce the roof and built it over a natural water course extending the length of the structure. Wood, as nature made it, was used in multitudinous decorative effects. Massive mirrors, over a hundred years old, and lighting fixtures, just as old, add exotic touches, while water wheels, rock gardens, stone fire places and rustic bridges add simple beauty.

A cuisine to delight the most fastidious is offered nightly, with the menus closely related to those of France. Dinner music, accompanies the melodies of running waters. A dance floor at one end of the

chateau provides entertainment and regular dinner dances are on the program for Wednesday and Saturday nights, with concert music on Sunday evenings. Music and entertainment are presented on other evenings of the week.

Count de Cathelineau has been beset by many difficulties but despite these handicaps opened on schedule last Tuesday, and is striving hard to continue to give something different in the entertainment and dining line.

His daughter, Mademoiselle Antoinette, presents interpretative dances every evening. Two former stage and screen actors, Henri Warner and Harry Davenport, provide songs and instrumental music each evening. Bets and wines will be served tomorrow evening.
