

STRATEGY USED TO MAKE DUNNE G. O. P. NOMINEE

Inside Story Shows Rufus Holman 'Talked Self Out of Nomination' — Voters Settled On Dunne at Last

By VIRGIL PINKLEY, United Press Staff Correspondent. STATE HOUSE, SALEM, Ore.—(UP) Political strategy worked in behalf of Joe E. Dunne to win the Republican gubernatorial nomination was revealed today.

The "inside" story came from Henry Hansen, political advisor to Governor Meier and state budget director. Hansen frankly admitted that he supported Dunne along with the Meier administration during the closing days of the primary election campaign.

"I was not so much for any one man as I was for the candidate who could defeat Rufus Holman," Hansen told the United Press. "Hansen told the United Press. His contempt for Holman probably exceeded only that of Governor Meier."

Had to Spread Word. "The only thing that had to be done was to get the word spread that Dunne was in the lead and would win the nomination. Once this was achieved with the aid of the Portland newspapers, the rest was easy."

Hansen said he attempted to get U. G. Alexander and Longman to spread the word that their campaign would be successful. These candidates presumably refused to follow the advice, or failed to carry it out enthusiastically.

"The people did not know whom to vote for ten days before election, except that they did not want to see Holman nominated," Hansen continued.

Holman "Stopper" Sought. The administration stumbled about for several weeks in its determined effort to find the man who could "stop Holman." Meanwhile the state treasurer continued to issue statements which apparently lost him larger numbers of votes.

McAlexander, 72-year-old retired major general, selected. When it appeared that he might not be the ultimate winner, support was transferred to Dunne. Once this was done, Hansen mixed his political medicine and it was administered on an effective scale. Most political observers are agreed that the movement to put Dunne across was timed with exceptional finesse.

Dunne Goes Campaigning. Then, Dunne himself, is a good campaigner in his own right.

He is popular with many factions and knows how to get votes. It has long been known that if anyone had a bill he desired to have introduced, the smiling, portly state senator would present the measure.

Eight years in the state senate have given Dunne a good following. He has been in the dairy and ice cream, insurance, restaurant and automobile businesses. Much of his legislative work has been devoted to measures of interest to the motorist and the dairyman.

Dunne did a sound piece of personal campaigning. He addressed letters to most restaurant owners throughout the state. Many restaurant workers urged customers to vote "for my old friend, Joe Dunne."

He spent considerable time in farmers' markets, and at dairy co-operatives. Dunne is easy to get acquainted with. He did not deal in personalities.

Holman Unrepentant. Holman believes the people were "not informed properly" when they failed to nominate him as the Republican candidate for governor. He does not think the many statements he made, considered useless and costly by many observers, injured his chances.

One veteran state house official commented after the election, "Holman is the second man who has talked himself out of almost certain gubernatorial nomination in recent years. W. A. Norblad did the same thing. Holman had everything to lose and nothing to gain in each statement he made."

State house circles wonder which department or departments the incoming governor will use to pay off political debts. The present administration has selected the public utility department as the principal "jumping ground." Veterans' politicians and campaign friends have been given positions in that department in large numbers.

LABOR SHORTAGE IN WASCO, HOOD RIVER

THE DALLES, Ore., May 24.—(AP) —What is described as an "acute shortage of labor" exists in the Wasco and Hood River county orchard and field districts.

Residents of the area are unable to harvest the cherry and pea crops without assistance, and extremely few transients have thus far arrived. The Dalles chamber of commerce yesterday asked Secretary of State Stadler to waive, temporarily, the ruling requiring non-residents to purchase Oregon auto license plates. The present necessity of buying these tags is believed to be keeping transients out of the region.
