

HEN'S LOVE LIFE PERILS EFFORTS SET EGG RECORD

Pennington No. 2, Barred Rock Biddy, Shows Signs of Desire to Brood as Laying Marathon Continues

AGASSIZ, B. C., May 25.—(UP)—Will the yearnings of motherhood spoil the chances of the hen believed best fitted to win the egg-laying record at Agassiz experimental farm?

A Pennington, world war veteran and nearby resident, was concerned today as a warm spring sun beat down on the pen housing his chief egg-laying threat—Pennington No. 2, Laying Contest.

Pennington No. 2, a heavy-set barred rock hen, is leading in the present year-long egg marathon in eggs laid and points scored. But she is being guarded with convent strictness to keep her from going maternal.

Roosters are barred from the general vicinity of her pen, but fanciers wonder if she gets that far away look every morning at sunup when the cocks begin to crow.

At last count, Pennington No. 2 laid 192 eggs in 196 days for a total of 191 points.

Leghorns Busy.

In the white leghorn division the 10 F. C. Evans birds led at the end of 28 weeks with 1499 eggs and 1618.5 points. This averaged five eggs per week per hen. It is considered remarkable because leghorns, while steady layers, often produce inferior eggs.

Points are awarded on the following basis:

One point for each egg which weighs 24 ounces to the dozen, and a penalty of 1-10th of a point for each ounce the eggs average under 24 ounces to the dozen. A bonus of 1-10th point is given for each ounce over the amount. Exceedingly bad shaped eggs and soft-shelled eggs shall not be officially credited.

Named if Wins.

To return to Pennington No. 2—she'll have that long name until she sets a record, at which time she'll be christened with a name of her own.

At present her title merely means she is the second hen in the Pennington group. If she fails to amass any laurels, she'll be just another biddy. Such is fame. A hero today...

What constitutes a world record in egg-laying is somewhat of a mystery here. The United States has one record, claimed by a California man, while Australia and other countries also boast high marks.

An unofficial world record for a barred rock, same breed as Pennington No. 2, is held by Lady Victorine, a relative of the present derby favorite. She laid 358 eggs in 365 days at Saskatchewan university.

From Heavy Layers.

Penny's own mother laid 236 eggs, her granddam 230 and her great granddam 308. The dam of her sire laid 268 and his son was the sire of the granddam who laid 306 eggs.

So it can be seen Pennington No. 2 is a feather off the old nest and has heredity on her side—provided she can stick to business and forget her love life the rest of the contest.

SILVER SHIRT LEADERS INDICTED IN CAROLINA

ASHEVILLE, N. C., May 25.—(UP)—William D. Pelley, national head of the Silver Shirts, reported linked with an American Fascist movement, and two aides, were indicted by the Buncombe county grand jury today on charges of violating the state blue sky law.

The 16-count indictment accused Pelley, Don D. Kellogg and Robert C. Summerville of selling worthless stock in the Calahad Press, publishers of the magazine, "Liberalization." Fraud and conspiracy to commit fraud also were alleged.

RECRUITS WANTED IN MARINE CORPS

The United States Marine corps desires young men for enlistment to fill vacancies which will occur during the months of June, July and August, 1934.

Requirements for enlistment provide that accepted applicants must be American citizens, unmarried, at least 18 years of age, of good habits and character, 66 inches tall or over, and able to furnish at least three letters of reference from reputable people.

HIGH TENSION WIRE KILLS FARM WORKER

NYSSA, Ore., May 25.—(AP)—Vern Crawford, 25, laborer on an Apple Valley farm, was electrocuted today when a cable on a derrick contacted a high tension power line carrying 11,000 volts. Crawford, who was attempting to move the cable, was killed instantly.
