Civil war site the president called the nation to a brotherhood in "a new understanding." Declaring sectionalism past, he condemned the "three elements" hindering progress which he declared to be:

"Those who seek to stir up political animosity or to build political advantage by the distortion of facts; those who, by declining to follow the rules of the game seek to gain an unfair advantage over those who live up to the rules, and those few who still, because they never have been willing to take an interest in their fellow Americans, dwell inside of their narrow spheres and still represent the selfishness of sectionalism, which has no place in our national life."
