

ADDITIONAL COIN FOR COAST SPANS GIVEN APPROVAL

SALEM, June 8.—(AP)—J. M. Devers, attorney for the state highway commission, today received a long distance telephone call from Courtney J. Fry, member of the legal staff of the PWA, to the effect that the application by the state of Oregon for an additional \$500,000 to complete the five coast bridge projects had been approved.

Fry stated that a mandatory loan agreement involving a new total of \$5,002,000, and a redraft of resolution had been prepared by him and were awaiting the president's signature. He expected the president's approval today and if so stated he would forward the papers by airmail tonight, so they would reach here Monday for signature by the state highway commission.

Devers, who had made plans following yesterday's highway meeting in Portland, to start for Washington, D. C., tonight, today decided to wait until the agreement reached here Monday. After the papers had been signed by the highway commission he would take them back to Washington.

In case the amendatory agreement and resolution re-draft are approved promptly by the state highway commission and the government loses no time in placing funds to the credit of the state, actual construction operations on all five of the Oregon Coast highway bridges should get under way within the next month.

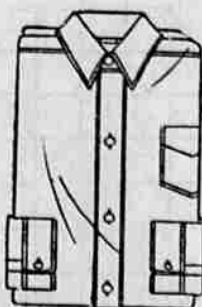
