NEW YORK, June 15.—(AP)—The sensational recession in trade has been less pronounced than it was in some of the years immediately preceding and in most divisions sufficient momentum has been gained to prevent a serious interruption of the general recovery movement, said Dun & Bradstreet today in the weekly trade review.

"Apparently a period is being entered," asserted the review "in which business will be held to a steadier level until crop prospects will have become more definitely ascertained."

LUMBER MILLS BOOST OUTPUT

SEATTLE, June 15.—(AP)—New business reported for last week by 307 mills in Oregon and Washington amounted to 37,465,834 board feet of lumber against a production of 53,837,136 feet and shipments of 48,696,483 feet, the West Coast Lumbermen's association announced today.

A total of 603 saw and operating mills in the two states reporting for the week, produced 54,034,133 feet, which was approximately 6,000,000 feet more than the preceding week and about 7,000,000 less than the second previous week.

The average weekly production of this group in 1934 has been 54,333,539 feet, compared with 63,035,400 in 1933.

BRAIN TRUSTERS ARE HIT BY SOLON

WASHINGTON, June 15.—(AP)—Declaring that the so-called brain-trust is only "window dressing for a lot of



plunder" at the expense of the American farmers, Rep. Dirksen (R., Ill.) has attacked sugar interests which, he said, were displacing millions of bushels of American grain by importing blackstrap molasses.

In a speech in the house, Dirksen traced what he called an interlocking system of sugar company boards of directors and governmental "big shots" which form a "strange and motley, but effective combination" to "take away what little liquor market remains for the outlet of corn."
