

GERMANY THROUGH AT GENEVA CONFERENCE IS HITLER'S DECISION

VENICE, June 15.—(AP)—Germany will not return to the Geneva disarmament conference despite conversations between Chancellor Hitler and Premier Mussolini. German correspondents were told at a press conference this afternoon.

The conference, to which only German newspapermen were admitted, took place immediately after Hitler's return from his second meeting with Mussolini.

The correspondents were told no accord would be signed as a result of the meeting, although the premieres found themselves in agreement on many points.

Nothing was decided with reference to disarmament, it was said, although diplomatic conversations between Germany and Italy on this subject will continue.

With reference to a possible Italian-German bloc to offset French and Russian blocs, correspondents were told no such step is being planned. The German newspapermen were told that the chief value of the meetings was to establish a personal contact which the chiefs of the two nations believe will be valuable in the future.

The conversations between Hitler and Mussolini began immediately after a luncheon at the golf club on the Lido. Again, as yesterday, they were alone as they conversed and they talked in German.

PIONEER HOMECOMING PLANNED IN ILLINOIS

SYCAMORE, Ill.—(UP)—Pioneer days will be celebrated by residents of De Kalb county in September when the county celebrates the 100th anniversary of its settlement with a four-day homecoming and historical review.

Much of the atmosphere of the early settlements of Illinois and De Kalb county will be reproduced on a site tentatively selected near the city of De Kalb.

Gov. Henry Horner will be invited to be a special guest of honor on Governor's Day at the celebration and other state officials will also be invited to attend.

A pageant depicting the history of De Kalb county during the past 100 years will be given nightly during the celebration.

\$250,000 DREAM HOME CAN BE BOUGHT CHEAP

NORTHPORT, Me.—(UP)—You can buy Ira Morris Cobe's \$250,000 "dream mansion" for \$30,000.

That is the price which realtors have set for the 30-room brick-and-marble home that the late Chicago banker built for his wife, the former Anna Watts of Belfast.

The Cobes were married in 1892. Mrs. Cobe longed for a home by the sea near her native Belfast, and her husband built the house, which now stands empty and silent at Northport overlooking the Atlantic.

Mrs. Cobe died in 1928 and her husband three years later.

EVANGELIST IS SAVED FROM BATH IN POND

PINDLAY, Ohio.—(UP)—A crowd of 250 union sympathizers, bent upon throwing Evangelist James Lowden, 32, leader of the World-Wide Gospel Courier movement, into a fish pond, was scattered by Sheriff Lyle Harvitt. Harvitt and his deputies refused to permit Lowden to deliver his weekly sermon from the court house steps, and amid jeers and boos, led the youthful evangelist away. A strong anti-union sermon by Lowden had aroused the ire of union men, whose sympathizers determined upon ducking Lowden in the pond. Fearing a riot, county commissioners ordered the sheriff to act.
