

many of them worried. It is a clause providing that the heir, supposedly the relative best suited to work the farm, is obligated to give the rest of the family a prop-er education and to provide for them in case of need. The malcontents declare this is ab-solutely impossible under present ag-

solutely impossible under present ag-ricultural conditions, especially aince the law forbids the contraction of debts on all farms in the "Erbhol" class. They insist the measure simply encourages their relatives to sponge on them, and that they themselves must hire extra hands to do the work

must hire extra hands to do the work formerly taken care of by communal efforts of the family. Non-Aryana cannot become "Erb-hof Bauer"-peasants. They must re-main "Landwrite"-farmers. And a non-Aryan by Nasi law is anyone with a parent, or grandparent of Jewish, or colored blood. Peasant has become an honored word in Nazi Germany, but the farmers say it has its diand-Many lawyers, it is reported, have

developed as a side in the sesistance of dissenting farmers to discover un-German ancestry, much as firms in other countries help the socially-minded to unearth gorgeous, if doubtful coats of arms.

doubtful coats of arms. There is a possibility, however, that the "Erbof" law will be allowed quietly to lapse, as have other Nazi measures. It is very difficult to ad-minister, especially in the face of im-portant resistance. Critics point out that it almost compels those members of a family left without an inheri-tance to drift into the clice, in di-rect oppation drug drug ice
