Creamed Eggs and Chicken for Two

2 tablespoons butter.

2 tablespoons flour.

1 cup milk.

1/4 teaspoon salt.

1/4 teaspoon paprika.

1/4 teaspoon celery salt.

2 hard cooked eggs, sliced.

1/2 cup diced cooked chicken.

1 teaspoon chopped parsley.

1 teaspoon chopped green peppers.

Melt butter and add flour. Mix and add milk and cook until creamy

Sauce forms. Stir constantly. Add rest of ingredients and cook one minute. Pour over mashed potato cake, rice or buttered toast.

Raspberry Pie Filling

2 cups raspberries.
1 cup sugar.
2 tablespoons flour.
1 teaspoon cinnamon.
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg.
1/4 teaspoon salt.
1 tablespoon lemon juice.
1 tablespoon water.
3 tablespoons butter.

Thoroughly wash berries. Add sugar and flour and blend well. Add rest of ingredients. Pour into unbaked pie crust. Cover with top crust and bake 10 minutes in moderately hot oven. Lower fire and bake 40 minutes in moderately slow oven.

A Tempting Salad

A good salad to serve during this season is made by placing slices of tomato, jelly on lettuce and topping with cream or cottage cheese and surrounding with salad dressing. This can serve as the main course for luncheon or supper.

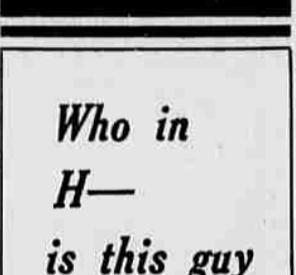
