

CROW WANTS HEARING OF ASHCRAFT CHARGE OF PURLOINING AUTO

Evan L. Crow and Chester O. Webb, local youths, charged in a complaint sworn to by Perry L. Ashcraft of Ashland with grand larceny for the alleged theft of an auto valued at \$475, were arraigned in Justice of the Peace William R. Coleman's court this morning. Webb waived preliminary hearing. Crow demanded one. Bonds were fixed for each at \$1000.

Crow was given time to procure and consult a lawyer. The date of the preliminary hearing in his case will be set as soon as possible, the court announced.

The authorities state that the two visited Ashcraft's garage in Ashland and represented that they intended to purchase the car. They are later alleged to have driven the car to this city without the owner's consent and to have left it parked on a local street, where it was later found.

Crow was released from the state prison several months ago on a two-and-one-half-year sentence for burglary in a dwelling. The incident was cited at the time by agitating forces as "a miscarriage of justice," and was made the basis of an attempted recall of Circuit Judge Norton. The authorities state their records show Crow has been the recipient of numerous paroles and involved with the law many times.
