

GRAND JURY MAY PROBE DEATH OF BEAGLE 'SUICIDE'

Evidence in the death of Jesse May Cook, 45, will be presented to the grand jury, Floyd Ross, foreman, for whatever action it may see fit during the session which starts next Tuesday, June 26, District Attorney Codding said today.

The body of Mrs. Cook was found beneath a tree near her home in the Beagle district March 3 last. Circumstances pointed strongly to suicide and the coroner's jury returned a verdict to that effect. The district attorney said the case would be discussed with the grand jury and if it desired to hear witnesses they would be called.

Settlement of the estate of Mrs. Cook, a well-known resident of the valley, has been under way for some months.

There are close to a dozen cases to be presented to the grand jury, including a number of liquor violations.

Jonathan Richardson and Bernice Kennedy, charged with larceny from the person, are also scheduled for investigation. The pair are alleged to have picked the pockets of a Jacksonville miner outside a North Pacific highway beer resort during June week and removed \$40. One of the women posed as intoxicated and thus won the sympathy and confidence of the miner who, while endeavoring to render first aid, allegedly lost his wallet.

E. L. Fitch, held in the county jail on a criminal libel charge for the circulation of campaign pamphlets, allegedly inspired by the prisoner, Earl H. Fehl, and May Murray, similarly accused and at liberty on \$1000 bail, are also scheduled for grand jury action.

It is expected that the grand jury will be able to complete its work in five days.

SIX MORE APPLY FOR AGE PENSION

Within the past week six new applications for old age pensions have been filed with the county court, acting as a pension board. The number of old age pensions granted now totals 137. There has been a decline in the number of applications the past six weeks.

The average amount paid each pensioner is between 11 and 12, which is slightly higher than in most Oregon counties where the pensions are granted. A number of counties have not yet started payments owing to depleted state of finances.

In this county all applications have been checked extensively and a number rejected because the applicant did not come under the provisions of the old age pension law as to age, length of residence in the state, or had children able to provide for them. A number of applications await signing of property reimbursement assignments. The law requires that if an old person owns more than \$3000 worth of property he agree to assign it to the county.

Pet Milk Recipes

Strawberry Shortcake

1. Measure into mixing bowl 2 cups of Bisquick, 2 tablespoons sugar.
 2. Stir in with fork 6 tablespoons Pet Milk diluted with 6 tablespoons water.
 3. Put on floured board and knead lightly until well mixed.
 4. Roll to 1/4-inch thickness.
 5. Cut into six 4-inch rounds.
 6. Brush tops with Undiluted Pet Milk.
 7. Bake in hot oven (450 degrees F.) 10 minutes, or until browned.
 8. Break open and spread with 2 tablespoons butter.
 9. Put together with mixture of 3 cups strawberries, mashed (about 1 quart), 1/2 cup sugar.
- Makes 6 shortcakes.
- Note: Peaches, oranges or pineapple (fresh or canned) may be used in place of the strawberries.

Tuna Fish Pie

- Melt in top of a double boiler 2 tablespoons butter.
- Blend in 3 tablespoons flour, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper.
- Stir in 1 1/2 cups Pet Milk diluted with 1/2 cup water.
- Cook for 5 minutes, stirring frequently.
- Then add 2 cups cooked or canned tuna fish, 3 hard-cooked eggs, sliced, 1 cup chopped celery, 1 tablespoon chopped onion.
- Pour into greased baking dish. Cover top with Plain or Quick Biscuits (See Index).
- Bake in hot oven (425 degrees F.) for 15 minutes, or until biscuits are brown. Serves 6.

French Fried Carrots

1. Cook 25 minutes, or until tender in uncovered saucepan 2 cups carrots (about 18 small carrots), 4 cups

- boiling water, 1 1/2 teaspoons salt.
 - Cut in halves lengthwise.
 - Beat together 1 well-beaten egg, 1/2 cup Pet Milk, 1/4 teaspoon baking powder, 1 cup pastry flour, 1/2 teaspoon salt.
 - Drip carrot halves into batter, one at a time.
 - Heat deep fat until hot enough to brown a 1-inch cube of bread in 30 seconds, or to 370 degrees F. on a cooking thermometer.
 - Fry a few carrots at a time until brown. Drain on unglazed paper. Serves 6.
- Note: When carrots are cooked whole, it is possible to slip the skins off as you would potatoes or beets.
