PWA ALLOCATIONS GO TO 28 CITIES

WASHINGTON, June 28.—(AP)—The public works administration today allotted \$3,313,680 for construction of 208 projects in 28 cities, Hawaii and Alaska.

An allocation of \$3,006,883 for projects in 20 states and Hawaii and Alaska was announced late today.

Officials estimated the projects announced today would provide the equivalent of a month's work for 197,981 men on construction sites and twice that amount of employment indirectly in industries producing and transporting materials.

The applicants, the PWA said, have promised that they will start work promptly.

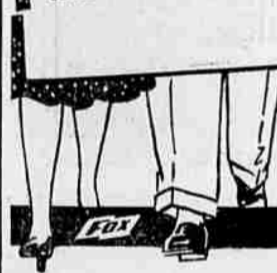
