This brings about better circulation, which means clearer skin and brighter eyes," he pointed out.

## MARSHALL DEATH WAS ACCIDENT OR SUICIDE, VERDICT

After deliberating for less than a half hour yesterday afternoon, following the testimony of the four remaining witnesses in the coroner's inquest into the death of William A. Marshall, also known as Billy Jolly, the jury issued the following statement:

"He met his death by the following means: A bullet discharged from a rifle by accident, either intentionally or accidentally."

Mr. and Mrs. B. C. Jolly, stepfather, and mother of the youth, who was found dead on Main street early Tuesday morning with a bullet wound through his head, today issued the following statement:

"In order to correct the impression that was given the public by the Medford Tribune for Tuesday, June 26, in regard to our son, William Marshall, we desire to have the following facts published:

"Billy was NEVER away from home over night and was NOT in the habit of being down town at all in the evening except when with us. We went to a few dances with him and have known at all times, until this last Monday, his whereabouts. About a month or six weeks ago he worked one evening in a bowling alley, but that was all.

"Billy had no work but had tried hard to get a job—even walking out to the Bear Creek orchard in an endeavor to obtain work thinning, and for two weeks he walked the two miles from our house to the box factory twice a day trying to get a job, but was too young.

"However, he was NOT despondent about obtaining work. He had just recently been promised work in a packing house and he was feeling very happy about it.

"Billy was very nervous, and all his relatives, and everyone who knew him, feel sure that his death was purely accidental.
