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\$100,000 LIQUOR PROFIT TO HELP STATE'S JOBLESS PORTLAND, Ore., June 29.—(AP)—Somewhat more than \$100,000 will be turned over to the Oregon unemployment relief fund on July 1 by the state liquor control commission, which already has sent \$44,000 to the state treasury. This statement was made by Geo. L. Sammis, administrator for the commission, at the Wednesday meeting here. Liquor sales will reach \$240,000 this month, compared with \$213,000 in May, Sammis estimated. Sales for the year, Sammis believes, will reach the two million dollar mark. The report of the administrator showed that store and agency payables have been decreased \$2788 in operation, compared with original operation. With the exception of the Oregon City store, all are on a profit-making basis, although 28 of the 110 agencies have yet to produce a profit. Sammis said other reductions in operating costs, including travel expense, will amount to about \$1100 a month. Early next week the commission will open its own bottling works and Sammis said this will mean a high grade blended liquor will be available at new low prices. There was some indication that the commission will recommend to the January legislature that beer license fees be boosted greatly. Chairman George W. McMoran said the present license of \$15 a year is "ridiculous" and he believes \$250 would be equitable. He explained that many places started "beer parlors" on a "shoestring," that the places have multiplied alarmingly and policing of them has become correspondingly more difficult.
