

# ROOSEVELT FLAYS DIE-HARDS; GIVES NEW DEAL PLEDGE

times "regimentation," sometimes "socialism."

"But, in so doing, they are trying to make very complex and theoretical something that is really very simple and very practical."

"I believe in practical explanations and in practical politics. I believe that what we are doing today is a necessary fulfillment of what Americans have always been doing—a fulfillment of old and tested American ideals."

To Enlarge White House  
To illustrate, he told how the White House office building would be enlarged and modernized while he was away on his sea trip.

"But the structural lines of the old executive building will remain," he said.

"The artistic lines of the White House were the creations of master builders when our republic was young. The simplicity and strength of the structure remain in the face of every modern test. But within this magnificent pattern, the necessities of modern government business require constant reorganization and rebuilding."

"If I were to listen to the arguments of some prophets of calamity who are talking these days, I should hesitate to make these alterations. I should fear that while I am away for a few weeks the architects might build some strange new Gothic tower or a factory building or perhaps a replica of the Kremlin or of the Potsdam palace."

Respect Old Lines  
"But I have no such fears. The architects and builders are men of common sense and of artistic American tastes. They know that the principles of harmony and of necessity itself require that the building of the new structure shall blend with the essential lines of the old."

"It is this combination of the old and the new that mark orderly peaceful progress—not only in building buildings but in building government itself."

Declaring that in a land of vast resources no one should be permitted to starve, he said relief would call for large expenditures for some time.

The paralysis that made this necessary, he said, "arose as the after-effect of that unfortunate decade characterized by a mad chase for unearned riches and an unwillingness of leaders in almost every walk of life to look beyond their own schemes and speculations."

Reform Necessary  
Reform and reconstruction are necessary, he said—"reform because much of our trouble has been due to a lack of understanding of the elementary principles of justice and fairness by those in whom leadership in business and finance was placed—reconstruction because new conditions in our economic life as well as old but neglected conditions had to be corrected."

After citing statistics to show progress of recovery, he said:

"But the simplest way for each of you to judge recovery lies in the plain facts of your own individual situation: are you better off than you were last year? Are your debts less burdensome? Is your bank account more secure? Are your working conditions better? Is your faith in your own individual future more firmly grounded?"

Have Rights Been Lost?  
"Also, let me put to you another simple question: have you as an individual paid too high a price for these gains?"

"Plausible self-seekers and theoretical die-hards will tell you of the loss of individual liberty. Answer this question also out of the facts of your own life. Have you lost any of your rights of liberty or constitutional freedom of action and choice?"

"Turn to the bill of rights of the constitution, which I have solemnly sworn to maintain and under which your freedom rests secure. . . . I have no question in my mind as to what your answer will be."

The president did not mention the "brain trust" but he said "the administration needs and will tirelessly seek the best ability that the country affords."

# ROAD AND TRAIL FUND INCREASED FOR FOREST USE

SALEM, June 29. — (AP) — About \$150,000 more funds will be allocated to Oregon for forest roads and trails, the state highway department was informed today by Secretary of Agriculture H. A. Wallace. This will bring the total for forest highways to about \$750,000, it was estimated.

Through an error Oregon's allotment was scheduled at nine per cent of the total, where in reality it should be about 14 per cent. Wallace explained by telegram that an error had been made in computation and that a correction was ordered in the allocation.

R. H. Baldock, state highway

engineer, also announced today that the state highway commission would print about 70,000 copies of the 1934 road maps of Oregon this year, which is more than double the amount usually printed.

The commission will issue these maps free to all distributing points, such as hotels, chambers of commerce, and service stations. Many thousands have already been sent out to hotels and civic organizations, and any others desiring them may obtain the maps by informing the highway department at Salem.
