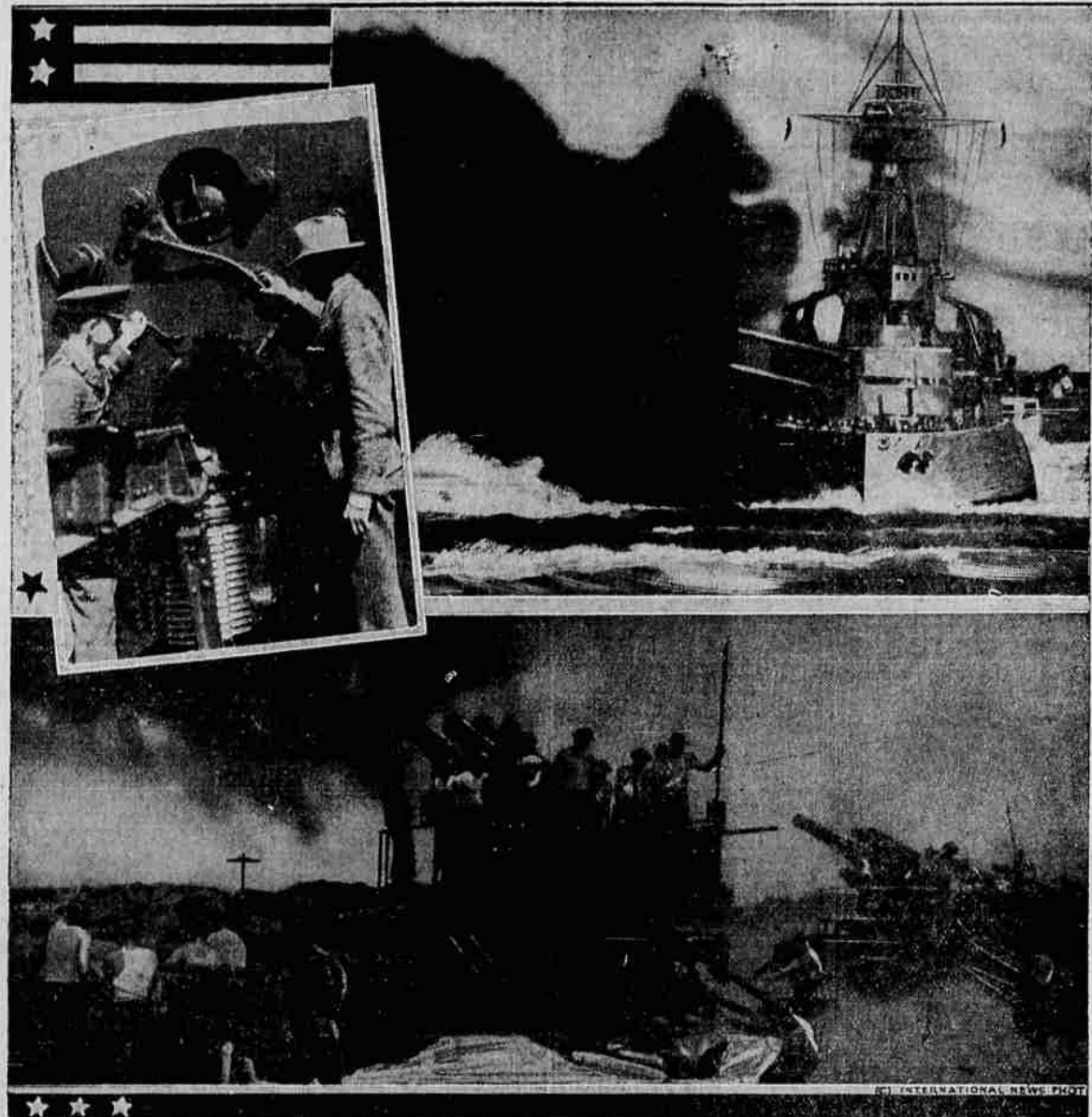


RETIRING MAYOR FETED BY HEADS OF DEPARTMENTS
