Under the leadership of F. D. Roosevelt, president of these United States, we can hope to build a new social culture without a parallel in western civilization, replete with progress in the arts and in the science of statecraft that will reflect greater enlightenment and humanity in our own lives and in our attitude toward the people of other lands.
