CANNERY WORKERS BATTLE FARMERS IN STRIKE RIOTING

BRIDGETON, N. J., July 10.—(UP)—Thirty-two men and women who participated in two bitter battles with police and farm vigilantes today were jailed last night, charged with "disorderly practice."

Justice of the Peace Joseph M. Stratton fixed bonds at \$1000 in each case after striking farm workers and cannery employes at Seabrook farms had fought two sharp engagements with officers. Sixty persons were injured.

Donald Henderson, former Columbia University professor, who has been a moving spirit in the walkout, was sought by police. His wife, Eleanor, was in custody. The prisoners included 10 women. Six of the women were negroes and all boasted that they were communists.

The local constabulary, reinforced by deputies, succeeded in quelling two serious outbreaks during the day without the aid of state troopers. Governor A. Harry Moore was urged to send troopers to the trouble some but by nightfall the situation was quiet and the extra men were not needed.
