

CIVIL SERVICE JOBS WILL BE FILLED BY OPEN EXAMINATIONS

Open competitive examinations for civil service positions have been announced by Earl H. York, secretary of the Civil Service Board of Examiners.

Examinations are open until July 24 for the position of junior agricultural statistician, Bureau of Agriculture Economics, Department of Agriculture, with salary at \$2000 to \$2800 a year, and associate veterinarian (diseases affecting wild animal life), with salary at \$2000 a year, Bureau of Biological Survey. Specified education and experience are required for both these positions.

The position of junior legal assistant (labor law) is also open for examination until July 30. The salary is \$2000 a year, and a college or law school education, including labor law and allied subjects, is required by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. This salary is subject to a deduction of not to exceed 5 percent during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1935, as a measure of economy. A further deduction of 3 1/2 percent will also be made toward a retirement annuity.

SECOND SPRAY DUE BY JULY 20

The second spray for control of second brood codling moth worms should be completed on all varieties of pears and apples by July 20, according to the advice of L. P. Wilcox, county agent and L. G. Gentner, entomologist of the 80. Oregon Experiment station.

A peak flight of second brood moths is now taking place and as a result a large number of young worms may be expected by the date mentioned above. Bartlett pears are becoming mature and therefore are more attractive to worms, growers of this variety are especially advised to apply a spray in order to prevent "pin hole" worm damage at harvest time.

Use three pounds of powdered arsenate of lead to the one hundred gallons of water. Spray thoroughly and avoid the worm situation as experienced last season.

GRANTS PASS, July 13.—(Sp.)—Preparing "the most beautiful camp spot in southern Oregon" for use by organizations and other groups, Al J.
