

STRIKE END STORY WAS PREMATURE

SAN FRANCISCO, July 19.—(UP)—A San Francisco evening newspaper late yesterday issued an extra edition asserting "general strike over—Bridges admits defeat."

Harry Bridges, leader of the militant longshoremen, was at that hour in session with the general strike committee at the labor temple.

No decision to terminate the general strike had been reached at 4:30 P. M.

Radio stations picked up the report and a mild wave of excitement was felt throughout the city.

It quickly died out, however, on official statement from union headquarters that the strike general committee was still in session and that no decision had been reached.

CULINARY CRAFT....

There is an old saying, "Make the sauce to fit the dish," which is just as good today as when first voiced. A new dressing makes a new salad. In fact, I might go so far as to say that the wrong dressing wrecks the salad. So, today in the interest of the most delightful salads possible, we are giving you a group of salad dressings. We hope you will find a new one among them and by its use, add another refreshing possibility to your summer meals.

Pineapple Dressing.
For Fruit Salad.

- 4 tablespoons flour
- 3 tablespoons sugar
- 1 cup pineapple juice
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup whipping cream.

Mix flour and sugar, then add pineapple juice gradually until thickened. Heat remaining juice then add the flour mixture and cook until thickened, stirring. Add butter and beaten eggs and cook until eggs have been absorbed thoroughly. (Do not overcook.) Chill and fold in whipped cream just before serving.

Foundation French Dressing.
Use a pint jar for mixing. Rub inside with garlic if you like the flavor. Place in the jar; shake well. Keep in refrigerator and shake well each time before using.

- 1/2 cup oil
- 1/4 cup vinegar
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon paprika.

Foundation Mayonnaise.

- 1 teaspoon mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 2 cups oil.
- 3 tablespoons lemon juice.

For fruit add 1/2 cup whipped cream. Whitefish add 1/4 cup catsup. 1/4 cup tart jelly.

Red fish add 3 tablespoons chopped pickles. 2 tablespoons chopped parsley. Chicken add 1 tablespoon chopped pimento. 1 hard cooked egg.

Eggless fish add 2 tablespoons prepared horseradish.

cooked sour cream dressing.

Mix together and bring to the boiling point.

- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon mustard
- 6 tablespoons sugar
- 1 tablespoon butter
- 1 cup vinegar.

Add gradually (mixed together); do not overcook.

- 1 cup thick sour cream
- 4 tablespoons flour
- 1 beaten egg.

Tomato Dressing.
Mix in a quart jar:

- 1 can of tomato soup
- 1/4 cup vinegar
- 1/4 cup oil
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 clove garlic
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 1 teaspoon mustard
- 1 tablespoon catsup.

Shake well and store in refrigerator, then shake each time before using.

FOUR-HOUR GRAPPLE BY CHAMPS ENDS IN DRAW

BOSTON, July 19.—(AP)—Wrestling was still without an undisputed heavyweight champion today because, judging by appearances and performances, Ed George and Jimmy London, the last of the long list of claimants, were too evenly matched.

This pair of grapplers, standard-bearers of rival factions now at peace after a long and bitter promotional warfare, entered the ring at Fenway park last night to complete the job of putting all the mat championship pieces together.

They started grappling shortly before 11 o'clock and four hours later, when they were groggy and almost helpless, the match ended a draw.

After knocking heads and toppling through the ropes, the exhausted pair finally managed to crawl back together. London staggered over to George and applied a wristlock. George threw him with a feeble back fall and then fell face downward.

The shock of the fall robbed them of their last bit of stamina and both were unconscious at the end.

This amazing exhibition drew a crowd of 30,000 with gate receipts estimated at \$50,000.

The 29-year-old George weighed 219 and had an 18-pound advantage over the St. Louis Greek, who admits 38 years.

The match was on a best-two-out-of-three falls basis, and each scored a fall early in the grueling struggle.

BABY STAR GETS \$1250 WEEKLY

HOLLYWOOD, Cal., July 19.—(UP)—Shirley Temple, five-year-old screen darling who was elevated to stardom in a series of "hit" pictures, today held an adjusted contract with the Fox studio calling for a salary reported to be \$1250 weekly.

The little starlet recently was placed on a strike by her parents, Mr. and Mrs. George F. Temple. They demanded \$2,500 a week for their talented daughter. She was drawing \$150 weekly. The studio offered \$1,000 a week, and then attorneys for both sides went into conference.

MORTGAGE FIRM FRAUDS CLAIMED

SALEM, July 19.—(AP)—Charges of irregularities by officers of the Western Bond & Mortgage Co. of Portland, as contained in the audit report of the state corporation commissioner's office, were submitted today to Attorney I. H. Van Winkle and the district attorney of Multnomah county by Charles H. Carey, corporation commissioner, for full investigation and recommendations for indictment and recovery of property in the interests of investors.

The report included indication of fraud in mortgage transactions with affiliated companies, and "disregard for the actual liability in withdrawal of securities," as well as the statement that the firm is "hopelessly insolvent at the present time."
