

### CANNING KITCHENS READY TO OPEN IN COUNTY MONDAY

Operation of the Ashland army canning kitchen as a part of the SERRA food preservation program will start Monday, it was announced today by Mrs. Mabel C. Mack, home demonstration agent, in charge of the work.

Monday, Thursday and Friday of each week the kitchen will be open in Ashland, while on Wednesday equipment will be transferred to Talent and on Thursday to Bellview.

Persons eligible in these districts are notified to report to their kitchen to receive appointment, and no food-stuffs should be taken to a kitchen previously.

Central Point, Eagle Point, Roxy Ann and Phoenix cases who are eligible should report to the Medford army, as operation of their kitchen will start Thursday, July 26. Next Wednesday, cases from Jacksonville, Applegate and Griffin creek who have previously made arrangements will be handled in Medford.

Jackson county relief committee has notified families of eligibility through the mail, and asks those who are unable to participate to so advise the committee.

### S. F. STEVEDORES DECLARE STRIKE FORCE UNBROKEN

San Francisco workers—except for several thousand teamsters and street car men—took up their tasks yesterday as the general strike committee voted, 191 to 174, for an end of the unified "protest" in support of the coast's striking maritime unions.

The 1,300,000 residents of the metropolitan area, their normal services nearly restored, scurried about their business, but heard with concern of reports from Portland. The Portland labor "strategy" committee voted to call a general walkout if state troops, mobilized by Governor Meier of Oregon, are moved onto the waterfront.

General Hugh Johnson, NRA administrator, continued to give his attention here to the maritime dispute and said he was attempting to win consent of employers and workers for arbitration by President Roosevelt's mediation board.
