

TEAR GAS, CLUBS USED IN CHARGE ON 2000 PICKETS

through police lines, shouting, throwing rocks, and tossing gas canisters back to police who had thrown them. The strikers extended their picket lines to the very gates of the docks, and effectively blocked railway movement of cargo from the docks.

All day yesterday police and pickets glared at each other or joked over the fight, while both sides rested in preparation for renewal of hostilities.

Fracas Starts Early

Police opened fire at 7 o'clock, and the strike lines broke. Men fled back from the waterfront, weeping, choking, retching, many going all the way up Queen Anne hill, a nearby residential district.

About 2000 strikers were massed at the docks this morning. Facing them were 300 police. As the foot officers opened fire with gas guns and started throwing bombs, a "cavalry squadron" of 20 mounted officers completed the rout, finishing with clubs at pickets who offered battle, and hustling the crowd along before a low-lying fast-rising cloud of gas.

Almost every man of the 2300 on the docks was affected more or less by the gas. Mayor Smith was slightly gassed.

The police were called for breakfast at 4 a. m., the mayor having kept his plans secret, although longshoremen had heard rumors that he would move against them soon.

"This is the big day, boys," the officers were told jokingly, and then the police army took posts.

Much Gas Used

The "cavalry troop" came through the gas cloud unscathed, the horses stepping over the gas, which clung to the ground. About 200 canisters of gas were discharged. Back of the gas barrage stood other officers, armed with short submachine guns, shot-guns and rifles, but these were not needed.

Several strikers were injured when they tried their old stunt of throwing exploding bombs back to police—a trick many of them learned in the world war. One of them was joking a policeman about it yesterday. The striker was a member of the veterans of foreign wars, he explained proudly.

"In France when a German grenade fell into a trench, we'd throw it back at the squareheads before it exploded," he said.

"You're telling me?" said the officer. "I used to do that myself in France."
