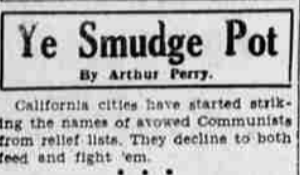

Will It Be War?

ALL THE elements that make for war are present in Central Europe today,—as they were 20 years ago,—but two. First, there is no extra cash with which to wage war.

The treasuries of Central Europe, in striking contrast to 1914, are empty. The rank and file of the people from the English channel to Trieste, are distressed, bitter and resentful.

In other words there is no cash and there is no real national unity. Widespread anarchy leading to Communism, far better describes the true situation, we believe, than mobilization leading to another European war.

If the truth were known, we venture to say, it would be found that Stalin is watching the developments in Austria today with far more relish and enthusiasm, than is the former Kaiser at Doorn.

That is assuming the Kaiser is, as he pretends to be, an ally of the League of Nations.

Why Not "Sell" the Climate?

YESTERDAY, we are told, was a hot day. Today, no doubt the report will be the same.

But the answer for one who has been in the East and Middle West for two months is, that no one in Southern Oregon knows what heat is.

The thermometer doesn't tell the story. The mercury has soared in Southern Oregon over the 100 mark, and may, before Fall, do so again.

But the result will not be heat, as the country east of the Rocky Mountains understands it. For it will be a dry heat in the first place; and a comparatively brief period of heat in the second. Dry heat may burn and annoy but it doesn't kill.

IT IS a truism that we seldom appreciate our blessings. The present writer can put it down as an historical and incontrovertible fact, that when it comes to climate, the people of Oregon do NOT appreciate their blessings.

That experience the writer has just had. It is an experience he never intends to repeat, unless some unexpected emergency demands it.

Drops of water wear away a stone. In the East and Middle-west, it is not only maximum heat, united with maximum humidity; but it's the absence of any relief night or day.

THE first foreboding war in Europe. The second points toward growing peace in America.

AND you will add, if you are exceedingly wise: "I hereby pledge myself to uphold and maintain American institutions and to oppose with all my power those who seek to overthrow and destroy these institutions."

DOLLFUSS, Austrian chancellor, anti-Nazi, is shot down by Nazis who apparently capture several members of the Dollfus government.

GERMANY is Nazi. Italy is fascist. Nazis and fascists have a fellow feeling for each other.

WHAT a mess! Things appear to get in a pretty bad way in this country at times, what with kidnappers and gangsters and strikes that seem to have something more back of them than the simple and commendable desire to improve the condition of those who work for wages, but even at our worst, we're far better off than hate-ridden Europe.

ANOTHER headline, more constructive: "Millions Allocated for Highway Work."

"We'll have to pay taxes for a long time in order to pay back this federal money that is borrowed, but at least we'll have the roads and in the next few years we'll make mighty good use of them."

FEDERAL money has been spent lavishly in the past year in order to create employment. Some of the things it has been spent for will be of permanent value. Many, many won't.

AT ANY rate, spending money for the things we've spent it for is vastly better than spending it for war—as Europe has done and is still doing.
