

**COPIES OF FARM
BANKRUPTCY ACT
AVAILABLE HERE**

Copies of the new farm bankruptcy acts of congress, June 18 and June 23, recently signed by the president, have been received by attorneys in Medford.

They are being studied with a view to projecting the mortgage sales of two or more of the larger orchards. These acts provide a method of staying pending mortgage foreclosure and extending all farmer debts six years. Further provision is made for the relief of municipal corporations—permits corporations in general to file debtor proceedings—permits individuals unable to obtain consent of a majority of creditors to submit their own plan for relief, staying pending suits and all debts secured and unsecured; suspends time under the statute of limitations—makes receivers, referees and other officers liable for state and local taxes.

The act also provides for a special commissioner, to be known as conciliation commissioner, who is given large discretionary powers to aid in the protection against confiscation of farm property under foreclosure proceedings of the state courts.

Upon the bankruptcy court acquiring jurisdiction of the bankrupt's property, either in straight bankruptcy, or debtor proceedings, the foreclosure of mortgages or sales thereunder may be stayed, and the farmer given ample time to refinance, and even operate his farm property upon the payment of small interest charges, all supervised by a proper officer of the court.

**'RED' MOVIE SHOW
IS BROKEN UP BY
G. PASS RESIDENTS**

GRANTS PASS, July 27.—(Sp.)—Barred from Evergreen hall and from the county fair grounds Tuesday, a showing of a "red" movie was broken up Wednesday night when an attempt was made to run the film at Ellis hall, Ninth and H streets.

Declaring they were representing the citizens of the state and the United States, a group of about 15 Grants Pass residents halted the moving picture, "Road to Life," being shown by its circulators, A. Johnson and Cliff Gould, sponsored here by the local unemployment council. The circulators were given 12 hours to leave town.

There were about 30 men, women and children at the meeting to view the film. An introductory speech, intended to describe the necessity for a new system of crime correction, was made by Gould. It was with reference made in this speech to the penal system used in the United States that the second group used as an excuse for demanding that the meeting be dismissed.

At first the objectors to the meeting delayed the film's showing by pulling out the fuse blocks that supplied power to the projector. When the objectors had departed and the operators attempted again to show the film, the local group returned and broke up the meeting.

The picture which depicted the "wolf" children of Russia who had been left parentless by the revolution and famine that followed, together with the "collective" system devised by the Soviet government for correction of the children, was about half run when the second group returned and crowded into the hall.

The picture was at first billed to be shown at the American Legion hall on Tuesday evening. This was eliminated by the fact that the hall has only one exit, making the showing of a film there in conflict with the law. It was then advertised for the same evening at the fair grounds, but the county court and county fair board published a statement in which they denied the group the right to hold such a meeting at that place.

**BIG CREW BUSY
ON NEW ASHLAND
RAIL UNDERPASS**

ASHLAND, July 27.—(Sp.)—Drilling and shovel work being done by the Hoffman Construction company of Portland is under way on the new undercrossing north of Ashland. Hoffman is employing approximately 15 local men, and M. C. Linsinger & Son, local contractors doing the hauling for Hoffman, are employing 15 local men.

It will take about a month to do the digging and, when that phase of the work is completed, a month and a half to build the abutments. The twelve hundred and fifty cubic yards of concrete will be poured into the wooden forms which will be constructed by local carpenters.

The railroad company will lay the steel soon for completion of the temporary trestle over the highway. The steel stringers are being laid now by bridge gangs so Hoffman's shovel crews can get to the south side of the undercrossing for digging.

When the undercrossing is finished and concrete is poured into the forms, preparations will be made for paving and laying of railroad steel.

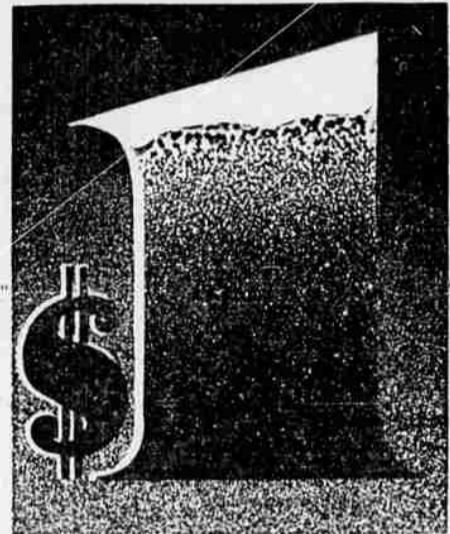
The work is scheduled to last well up into November before the undercrossing is ready for traffic. The route which motorists must take to get through the scene of construction is very dangerous and motorists are warned to exercise great care and caution in approaching the crossing. Too speedy driving will cause a crash into the piers of the temporary trestle which drop to the pavement.
