

BRUSH FIRE NEAR KENO HALTED BY ALL NIGHT FIGHT

Farm Homes, Crops and Timber Saved — Power Lines Crippled and Klamath Falls Smoke Blanketed

KLAMATH FALLS, July 28.—(AP)—A spectacular fire on the outskirts of Keno, tiny community west of Klamath Falls on the road to Ashland, was brought under control during the night. Forty men working constantly until dawn turned the blaze away from farm homes, crops and valuable timber.

Starting as a brush fire Friday afternoon, the flames raced along a seven-mile front between Wenden and Keno. A brisk wind brought the conflagration to within three-quarters of a mile from the highway community and then changed, carrying the flames back along the previous burn.

Many acres of thin, second growth pine were destroyed as the fire rushed on through the tinder-like grass. Two little used bridges on an old county road were burned when it leaped the breaks. Although several fields of rye were lost as the fire moved near farm homes, no buildings were destroyed.

Five power poles were burned out and a California Oregon Power company distribution line cut off. Telephone connections in part of the district were out for a time. Late last night the fire was so menacing farmers started moving their household goods.

The heat from the blaze alone was sufficient to spread the fire to fields at a distance of several yards. All through the night Klamath Falls was covered by a haze of smoke but this morning the atmosphere cleared as the fire was placed in control.

No further danger was expected unless an unfavorable wind developed.

MISSISSIPPIANS IRE BOILS WHEN NEGRO LASHED TO DEATH

PALAHATCHIE, Miss., July 28.—(AP)—The whipping to death of Henry Bedford, a negro born in slave days, sent anger surging through this little town today.

Four white men, accused of murder, were hurried to jail at Brandon last night. Sheriff Virden Therrill of Rankin county, who made the arrests, said he had delayed preliminary hearings because feeling was running high.

The negro had been known to almost every resident here for years. Alex Murray, John Scales and Benny Cawthorne, all of Palahatchie, and M. M. Dotson, of Shiloh, were under arrest. They were denied bond, pending a hearing next Wednesday.

Cawthorne charged the negro, a tenant of his father, D. W. Cawthorne, talked "disrespectfully" when they disputed a rental agreement.

The sheriff said the man took the 70-year-old negro to a secluded spot outside the town Wednesday and whipped him with a heavy leather strap.

The sheriff said he was notified of the beating five hours later and went to the scene with Cawthorne and a doctor.

He said the negro was lying on the ground, unable to move, and although he was taken into town and given medical treatment, he died that night.

SLOT RACKETEERS GRANTED PARDONS

PORTLAND, July 28.—(AP)—Two slot machine distributors, Royden H. Enloe and Earl Wurzweller, sentenced to six months in jail for assault and battery, were free today after having served only two months of their sentences.

The two were released Friday afternoon on conditional pardons extended by Governor Meier.

Enloe and Wurzweller were convicted of assault on Clyde S. Betts, a private detective, who went to Wurzweller's establishment to return for a consideration, two slot machines that had been stolen.

In extending the pardons, the governor said the action was taken on recommendation of Circuit Judge Kanzer, the committing magistrate. The supreme court, upholding the verdict of the circuit court, had described the assault on Betts as "most cowardly and brutal beating."

District Attorney Langley opposed clemency and spoke of the acts of the convicted men as "acts of gangsterism."

No Fair Exhibit.

PORTLAND, July 28.—(AP)—Plans for an Oregon exhibit at the Century of Progress exposition in Chicago this year have been abandoned by the Chamber of Commerce here. A campaign to raise funds to finance the exhibit has netted only \$1090. This money will be returned.
